Park ski trails are located in Munising and Grand Marais. Trails wind through a magical landscape in a variety of habitats and topography. Beech, maple, hemlock, and conifer forests, and old fields grow on the sandy uplands and rugged hills of old glacial features.



Each trail offers a variety of lengths for a leisurely day ski or quick workout at the end of the day. All park trails are designed for diagonal stride only (classic skiing)- skating is not permitted.

Trail junctions are marked with green posts and maps are available at most intersections. Trails are groomed regularly - watch and listen for grooming equipment when you ski.

Whether you are a novice or an accomplished skier, we hope you find the trails challenging and fun.

For Your Safety

- Ski with a partner. Or let someone know where you are going and when you expect to return.
- Dress in layers and anticipate changes in the weather.
- Storms are common in the area and may rise quickly leading to white-out conditions and heavy snow fall. Wind may obliterate the trails.
- Heavy weekend use and alternating daytime thawing and nighttime freezing may turn snow packed slopes into fast, icy runs.
- Watch and listen for grooming equipment.
- Be alert at snowmobile crossings on Trails A and B.
- Darkness comes early in winter so allow plenty of time to return to your vehicle before dark.
- To avoid ruining groomed tracks, snowshoeing, walking, and skating are not permitted on the ski trails.
- Pets, snowshoes, fires, camping, bicycles, and drones are prohibited.
