Participants will also visit two fascinating petroglyph sites. Stories and Stars - Join us for an evening of stargazing and stories related to the cosmos. Park ranger and Kaibab Paiute tribal member Benn Pikyavit will share astronomical stories of the Kaibab Paiute and other cultures. The Dixie State University Astronomy Club will bring several telescopes for up close viewing of night sky objects and help us learn to identify early winter constellations and planets. Dress warmly! - Nov 10 Pah – Water in Paiute: learn the what, why and how of water at Pipe Spring for the Paiute.
- Nov 24 Powell and the Paiutes: Learn about this interesting relationship, which took place in the late 1860s through the early 1870s.
