





# How is the TPAP Different from the GMPA?

- General Management Plan Amendment (GMPA) 2021
  - Addressed management of lands leased for ranching in Point Reyes and north district Golden Gate National Recreation Area and freeranging tule elk in those areas
- Tomales Point Area Plan (TPAP) 2023
  - Addresses management of the Tomales Point area
  - No active ranching in this area of the park
  - No free-ranging tule elk in this area of the park

# Recreational Activities at Tomales Point



## **Purpose and Need**

- The purpose of the plan is to establish the management direction at Tomales Point for protecting natural resources, preserving historical and cultural resources, preserving wilderness character, and improving visitor experience.
- The need for this project arises from:
  - Recent droughts that required NPS intervention to protect the elk herd.
  - The effects of climate change and the need to adapt management strategies accordingly.
  - The partnership between the NPS and the Federated Indians of Graton Rancheria to ensure collaboration on future management strategies.

# **Alternative A:**


Continue Current Management (No Action)

- Continue current management which has required waivers to NPS policy on wilderness and wildlife management.
- Tule elk would be managed as a confined herd, the elk fence would remain.
- Supplemental water infrastructure would remain in place, used as needed.
- Pierce Ranch would remain a passive outdoor exhibit with employee housing.
- Trail maintenance for the Tomales Point and McClures Beach trails remains unchanged.
- Overnight camping / day use would continue for beaches and coves along Tomales Bay, north of the elk fence.



- Partner with the Tribe for preservation and protection of significant resources
- Remove existing elk fence and nonhistoric water systems
- Discontinue provision of supplemental water and minerals
- Remove 12 elk exclusion fences from Wilderness
- Protect wilderness values such as the importance of healthy, intact ecosystems and opportunities for solitude or primitive and unconfined recreation quality





- Improve facilities at Pierce Ranch for visitor use, revise circulation patterns, and add a spur trail to a new overlook of Tomales Bay
- Add new vault toilets at Pierce Ranch area and increase parking capacity
- Improve and maintain the Tomales Point and McClures Beach trails
- Improve visitor use management for Tomales Bay beaches and coves through refinement of the camping program, including a site-based reservation system.



**Alternative C:** 

Maintain Elk Fence and Actively Manage Elk Population

- Management recommendations would be the same as the NPS proposed action (Alternative B), except as noted below
  - Retain and maintain the elk fence
  - Active management of elk population, based on carrying capacity of habitat, through lethal removal
  - Remove non-historic water systems and enhance naturally occurring water at springs and seeps
  - Overnight camping at the beaches and coves with a site-based reservation system

- Wilderness character
- Cultural resources
- Wildlife, including tule elk
- Visitor use and experience

The analysis may also consider effects of the alternatives on areas outside of the planning area.


