UPDATED: August 28, 2020 [07:30am PDT]

Fire activity remained moderated under the marine layer but as that layer cleared, fire behavior picked up and moved faster. Air resources were able to fly when visibility cleared enough to allow for safe operations. The dozer line on the west side of the fire was completed. Burnout operations occurred yesterday and will continue in the southwest portion of the fire utilizing Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) and hand ignition. Direct and indirect line construction and holding operations will continue on the north, east and west sides of the fire. Contingency lines will continue to be completed and improved.

Weather: A shallow marine layer will be present in the morning, especially in the coastal areas but will erode quickly. Humidity is expected to be 90–100% in the morning while the minimum humidity in the afternoon is expected to drop to about 50–60 percent with higher values near the coast. Daytime high temperatures will be between 65–75 degrees. There will be southwest winds 3-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph. Residents may notice an increase in smoke and poorer air quality is expected for the area.
