21 nests found
7 hatched
10 failed (predation/wind/tide/unknown)
4 are being incubated (11 eggs)

Eggs

55 eggs laid
21 hatched (38%)
23 failed (predation/wind/tide/unknown)
11 incubating

Chicks

21 hatched
17 died (80%)
3 brooding (being raised by father)
1 fledged (survived to 28 days)
