



## WOODWARD FIRE

Northern Rockies National Incident Management Team 2

**UPDATED:** August 26, 2020 [07:30am PDT]

Fire activity yesterday was low to moderate due to a relatively humid marine layer over the fire. Fog and smoke hindered visibility, which limited water drop operations for most of the day before they picked up in late afternoon.

Today's operations will continue with direct and indirect line construction on north, east and south sides of the fire. A dozer line on the north side of the fire is <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> done and is expected to be completed by the end of the day. Crews will finish scouting and start to implement a new dozer line

along Meadow Trail on the north side of the fire, as well as continue contingency plan preparations along Limantour Road. They will start mop up work along the south portion of the fire, which should limit the fire in the coastal brush and limit southern movement into the flashy fuels toward Bolinas. Crews will continue structure assessments and preparation around the areas of Inverness, Inverness Park, Point Reyes Station, and Olema.

Weather: A marine layer will be present in the morning for all locations and into the afternoon for areas near the coast. Maximum relative humidity is expected to range from 90–100 percent in the morning. Daytime highs will be in the mid 60s. During late morning into the afternoon, west to northwest winds will increase with some gustiness across the higher elevations and locations along the coast. Minimum relative humidity will be in the 60–80 percent range. Higher range values near the coast and across the fire with lower values in Bear Valley.
