


Humpback Whales

North Pacific Humpback Whales feed in the colder waters off Alaska during the Summer. They migrate south in the winter to mate, calve and nurse their young.

See if YOU can identify the behaviors below?



In the same way, no two blacktip reef sharks have the same pattern on their dorsal fins.


The photos below show sharks in Pelekane Bay. Draw a line between the fins that are identical.



Cetaceans


