



## **Picnic Area Rules and Regulations** **Pu‘uhonua o Hōnaunau National Historical Park**

*Please help us protect this area, with your help we can preserve this culturally significant site and provide a safe place for families to enjoy into the future.*

- 1. Preservation of natural, cultural and archaeological resources.** Dead wood may not be collected anywhere in the park. Creating stone messages are prohibited. No digging, scraping or excavating allowed. *Children playing with shovels/Tonka toys etc... is considered scraping, digging, excavating.* 36CFR2.1
- 2. Beach umbrellas, shade tents, canopies, free-standing tents are prohibited.** *The use of these items detracts from the cultural landscape of the area and detracts from the traditional Native Hawaiian cultural values for which the park was established.* 36CFR2.1
- 3. Pets (dogs, cats, others) must be restrained on a leash,** which shall not exceed six feet in length, or otherwise physically confine a pet at all times. *Do not tie your pet to a tree or the table, the regulations specifically state “under your physical control”.* 36CFR2.15(a)2
- 4. Pet excrement must be placed in garbage containers.** 36CFR2.15 (a)5
- 5. Loud music or other audio disturbances are prohibited.** The operation of vehicle audio systems, portable audio devices or musical instruments in a manner of unreasonable impact to other park users is prohibited. 36CFR2.12(a)1(ii).
- 6. No open fires.** All cooking will be limited to camp stoves or contained charcoal fire grill. Tiki torches and candles are prohibited in the park. 36CFR2.13(a)2
- 7. No recreational activities are allowed.** *For example:* Frisbee, volleyball, horseshoes, kite flying, baseball, football, soccer, streamers and balloons, and setting up hammocks. 36CFR 2.11
- 8. Special Use Permits are required for the following:** All wedding ceremonies and photography. Groups of 20 persons or more engaged in parties/gatherings, special events, public assemblies and meetings, or political gatherings require a permit. All parties may not exceed 50 persons per permit. 36CFR1.5(d)
- 9. Collecting seashells, coral stones, nuts (coconuts) and fruits are prohibited.** 36CFR2.1(c)(1),(c)2
- 10. This is a “Day Use” area only, no overnight camping is allowed. Those who are in the park for “shoreline access” must be at the shoreline.** 36CFR2.10, 36CFR2.3
