5. Description of Event
The Festival opens Saturday with the Royal Court procession, followed by hula, games, crafts, and canoe rides. On Sunday there will be more hula and crafts, Hawaiian food tasting, hukilau, and closes with the Royal Court procession.

The festival is a special time when children, kupuna, and visitors come together for two days of fun, laughter, sharing, and learning. Visitors can experience, interact with, and be inspired by a “living culture.”

The Festival has become a tradition for the local community, an event where the younger generation can learn about their culture and experience their heritage. This Festival provides a time and place where traditional cultural demonstrators and artisans can share their knowledge and skill with a new generation of practitioners.
