





PETS

Pets, with the exception of guide animals, are not permitted on park trails, at programs, or in park buildings.



Why Not?

-  Pets may chase, injure, spread disease to, or kill protected park animals.
-  Pets may be seen as prey by predators such as mountain lions, bears, and coyotes, placing both pet and owner in danger.
-  Normally well-behaved pets can become stressed by unfamiliar surroundings and may threaten visitors in close situations, such as on park trails.
-  Pets tend to mark territory, which may interfere with native wildlife patterns.

Where Can I Walk My Dog On a Leash?

Nearby Public Areas

Nearby public areas that allow pets under your control include:

- ✓ Six Rivers National Forest/Smith River National Recreation Area
 - all campgrounds, as long as pet is leashed
 - pets are permitted on trails under your control
 - Myrtle Creek Trail, Highway 199 at South Fork Road
 - Craig's Creek Trail on South Fork Road

- ✓ Beaches in Crescent City
- ✓ Moonstone Beach - Highway 101, Westhaven Drive exit
- ✓ Clam Beach County Park - Highway 101, Clam Beach exit
- ✓ Arcata Community Forest

Please inquire locally for specific regulations.


ALERT! Keep dogs away from any dead fish that may be found along the river banks. If eaten, raw salmon is extremely toxic.

Redwood National and State Parks Suggested Dog Walks

Your dog, cat, or other pet is welcome **on a leash not exceeding six feet**, under your control, and without creating a disturbance to visitors or wildlife, at the following park locations:


-  All road accessible beaches, except in dune habitat
-  On and within 100 feet of all public roads and parking areas, except on trails
-  All picnic areas

All road accessible campgrounds



Suggested areas north to south:

- ✓ Jedediah Smith Redwoods State Park campground & day use area
- ✓ Howland Hill Road
- ✓ Walker Road
- ✓ Crescent Beach and picnic area
- ✓ Mill Creek campground and access road
- ✓ Wilson Creek Beach
- ✓ Alder Camp Road
- ✓ Cal Barrel Road, only as far as vehicles are allowed
- ✓ Elk Prairie campground and picnic area
- ✓ Gold Bluffs Beach and campground
- ✓ Orek-w picnic area and Freshwater Lagoon Spit
