Duties:

Any alterations or additions must be accompanied by the park staff supervisor's and volunteer's initials.

Description of work to be performed, including minimum time commitment required.

Duties: fuels reduction, hazard tree removal, hauling rounds and slash. Much of the work is physically demanding and done at elevations between 8,000 and 12,500 feet. Work days are typically 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. but may end earlier if the volunteer decides s/he is too tired to continue.

Cutting: cutting trees, limbing trees, bucking logs, and cutting brush if volunteer is certified as a sawyer. This includes the use of chainsaws. Appropriate training, oversight, equipment, Protective Personal Equipment (PPE) and adherence to the associated JHA (Job Hazard Analysis) are required. If the volunteer is not operating a chainsaw s/he may work near, but not next to, those who are operating chainsaws. The volunteer is required to adhere to spacing and other standards established in the JHA. Work is considered hazardous in nature and physically demanding.

Moving Slash and Rounds: Once material is cut duties include manipulation by hand or wheel barrow to consolidate material into burn piles or onto trucks for removal. This may include heavy lifting (up to 50 lbs.) and repetitive lifting. Walking with loads on uneven terrain for short distances (less than 300 yards) is standard. For some of the taller trucks to be loaded, lifting may be over the head or shoulders. Duties require adherence to the JHA protocols for this task including PPE. Axes and hand saws may be utilized to make slash more manageable. Rakes and brooms are also used to clean up the site once work is completed.

Hauling Slash and Rounds: Once the trucks (dump trucks, dump bed stake side truck, pickup trucks) are loaded, material is driven by licensed drivers with appropriate certifications to disposal sites. Some volunteers will drive pickup trucks and vans to transport other volunteers to and from the work site. A JHA for this duty is also established and must be adhered to.

If the volunteer has any known or suspected physical condition that may be complicated by these duties or the generally strenuous nature of the work s/he should first consult his/her health care provider before commencing work

At any time the volunteer is empowered to decline any duties if s/he feels it is unsafe or beyond his/her physical capacity without reprisal from or ridicule by others.
