


**Check in** After 1 pm **Quiet Hours** 10 pm- 6 am

**Speed Limit** 15 mph









Fires are only allowed in the metal fire grates provided. Do not move fire grates or create fire rings. Never leave fires or coals unattended. Fires must be completely out before leaving the campsite or going to bed.



Some wildlife depend on the darkness of night. Keep lights pointed down, avoid bright settings, and use red-light flashlights when possible.



## **Campground Features**

**Comfort stations** with sinks for washing dishes and disposing of waste/ gray water.





**Solar shower stall**. Must bring your own solar heated shower bag.

Use of portable showers or shower tents is not allowed in the park.

### **Additional Information:**

- Maximum 8 people per site in Loop A, B, C, and D.
- **Generators** are permitted except in E Loop and may be run between 7:30-10 am and 4-8:30 pm.
- Vehicles (includes trailers/RVs) must be completely parked on designated gravel or pavement.
- Overflow parking may be available. Talk to a ranger or campground host.
- During Timed Entry, Moraine Park campers have access to all areas of the park, including the Bear Lake Road Corridor.

## **Food Storage Requirements**

Wildlife depend on you to stay alive and healthy! You can protect wildlife by properly storing all scented items and food. All campers are required to use food storage lockers, unless



Food storage locker


- Scented items and food that must be stored include, but are not limited to:
  - Food, chewing gum, drinks, and drink containers or water bottles
  - Cleaning supplies

staying in a hard-sided RV.

- Toiletries (soap, shampoo, sunscreen, deodorant, lip balm)
- Cosmetics
- Pet food and bowls
- Garbage (food scraps, empty cans or bottles, food wrappers)
- All coolers (including "bear-proof"), stoves, grills, non-disposable tableware, and cookware must be stored in food storage lockers.
- Wildlife can visit at any time. Never leave scented-items unattended. Keep these items in food storage lockers at all times when not in use. Improperly storing or leaving out food, garbage, or scented items will result in confiscation and/or citation.


