Apply for the Teacher to Ranger to Teacher Program
Summer 2010

Put on the Ranger uniform, receive training, and work for the National Park Service at San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park for eight weeks between June 14 and August 6, 2010; then, bring your experience back to the classroom to share with your students. Help the National Park Service foster stewardship for new and diverse generations of Americans.

Teachers receive a \$600/week stipend, a uniform, and a week of ranger training at the park from June 14-18, 2010.

The Teacher-Ranger will have the opportunity to work on various projects and activities including, but not limited to, conducting Junior Ranger and interpretive programs, writing and/or reviewing curriculum-based school activities for all grades, participating in outreach efforts, and working behind the information desk at the Visitor Center.
