The goal of **WEED FREE TRAILS** is to hike the Saguaro National Park trails network, eradicating exotic and invasive plants that threaten the native ecosystem. Volunteer weed-free trail monitors will hike and examine trail segments a minimum of 4 times per year, independently and on a very flexible schedule.

WEED FREE TRAILS is a great way to get involved with Saguaro National Park and learn a variety of skills such as:

- Plant identification
- GPS training
- Outreach
- Cultural training
- Radio training
- Hiking safety
