

WHO MAY PARTICIPATE AND REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY:

Who May Enter: Residents of and visitors to San Juan County are eligible to participate. National Park Service employees are ineligible but volunteers are welcome to enter.

Subject Matter: All entries must be inspired by a wildflower(s) of the San Juan Islands and their pollinator(s).

Number of Entries: Limit one work per person.

Medium: All entries must be original artwork and may be of any medium type.

Sizes: 2-D size 8"x10" or 11"x14" ONLY, portrait or landscape in orientation. 3-D size between 4" and 18" square.

2-D Entry Prep: 2-D entries must be mounted on photo mounting board or foam core with several strips of Velcro tape (hook side) affixed to the back surface of the mounting board sufficient for hanging.

May Art Contest Display: All participants must agree to the public display of their works at both a public location and online.

Return of Artwork: All artwork* must be picked up during the week of May 12-16. San Juan Island National Historical Park cannot assume responsibility for art not picked up during the assigned week.

*The top ten pieces will be on display at the San Juan Island Public Library from April 26-June 28. Pick up for the top ten entries will be the week of June 30-July 4.

Wildflower Species Reference: Contact the park with any questions regarding wildflower reference materials.

HOW TO ENTER:

Read and follow all contest guidelines.

Prepare your art entry, fill out the entry form (PRINT clearly), and submit your artwork and entry form to the Community Arts in the Park art receiving site listed below*:

*Entries must be hand delivered to the receiving site, do not mail entries.

Deadline: All entries must be received between **April 1-11, 2014.**

Judging Process: Up to 30* works will be on display at American Camp and online for public voting.

*If we receive greater than 30 entries, works will be judged by a panel of local artists, botanists, and naturalists and narrowed down to 20 entries for public voting.

Judging Criteria: Artwork entries must be a creative rendering of a San Juan spring wildflower(s) and their pollinator(s) and will be judged on the basis of original design and artistic composition.

Display of Winning Artwork: The top ten works will be displayed for public viewing at the San Juan Island Public Library, April 26-June 28. All works will be photographed and available for viewing on our website as well as on display at American Camp during the May 3-4 BioBlitz.

Awards: All contestants will receive a certificate of appreciation for their work as community artists and as conservation leaders. Ribbons will be given to the top ten entries, and prizes will be awarded to the top 3 entries.

Artist Recognition Ceremony: All contestants are invited to the recognition ceremony at American Camp on May 3, 2014 at 3pm.

INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS AND SUPERVISING ADULTS:

Adults, please explain and discuss with your children/students the rules of this competition along with the criteria upon which the artwork will be judged, including the ethics of art.

Rangers Visit the Classroom: Invite a ranger to visit your classroom to orient students to this art program. Contact raena_parsons@nps.gov or call 360-378-2240 ext 2222 to sign up.

Recommendation for Large Groups: If all or a large number of students from your school choose to participate in this program, we recommend that schools have students vote on top entries to be sent to the competition. Perhaps remaining works can be put on display at your school.
