



Cut and Assemble a Grand Banks Dory

You will need:

crayons
scissors
tape or glue
a hole punch
a straw

This illustration shows a Grand Banks dory off the coast of Newfoundland. The fisherman are yelling to let the schooner where they will deliver their catch know where they are.



Instructions:

1. Color your dory. The wax from the crayon will make it more seaworthy.
2. Cut out the dory along the outline.
3. Fold along the dotted lines.
4. Glue or tape the tabs on the bottom to the inside of the sides, curving the sides.
5. Glue the tab on one side of the bow to the other, and glue the two parts of the stern on top of each other.
6. If you want to give your dory a sail, punch a hole in the seat where it is marked.
7. Glue the seats in place to the inside of the boat.
8. Tape the sail to the straw, and place it in the hole in the front seat.
9. Try out your dory in a sink or bathtub!
