Explore Salem Maritime National Historic Site

Visit the historic buildings and waterfront of Salem's national park staffed by National Park Service Rangers and Volunteers.

• **U.S. Custom House, Public Stores and Scale House (Open Sat. & Sun. 10-4).** See the original 1826 eagle up close, Nathaniel Hawthorne's office, and the attached warehouse used for the storage of bonded and impounded cargo.

• **Narbonne House (Open Sat. 11-3 & Sun. 1-3).** Visit this 1675 house and learn how archeology has helped us to understand the families who resided here.

• **Front Yards of Historic Houses. (Sat. & Sun. 10-5).** Meet living historians and join in some lively conversations. Don't forget to visit the Milliner's Shop!

• **Derby Wharf.** Stroll in the footsteps of merchants and mariners out to Derby Light.

• **Waite & Peirce (Hours are posted at store).** Stop in and shop for "authentic & exotic goods" & support the national park.

• **Derby House Gardens.** Stroll through the garden and see what's blooming.
