

Salinas Pueblo Missions National Monument

Superintendent's Compendium

March 2016

Under the provision of 16 U.S.C., Section 3, and Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter 1, Parts 1-7, the following Superintendent's Orders (compendium) are established for Salinas Pueblo Missions National Monument. Unless otherwise noted, these orders apply in addition to the provisions contained in Parts 1-7 of Title 36 CFR:

Note: Violations under this section should be cited under §1.5(f).

§1.5 Closures and public use limits.

(a)(1) The following areas are closed to all public entry for the protection of cultural resources: unless appropriate permits or Superintendent's approval have been obtained.

- Abó Unit --
1. The rock shelter along U.S. Hwy 60
 2. All public lands other than the established roads, trails and visitor use facilities, the picnic area, and the residence easement.
*Note the rock art education area along Canyon Espinosa is closed unless accompanied by a ranger or the appropriate approvals and/or permits have been obtained.
- Gran Quivira - All park lands other than the entrance road, the interpretive trail system, the picnic area and the visitor use facilities (including All park lands east of the point where the service road from the water tank meets the large plaza on the east side of Mound 7.)
- Quarai Unit - All park lands other than established entry road, the interpretive trail system, the picnic area and visitor used facilities.

Launching, landing or operating an unmanned aircraft from or on lands and waters administered by the National Monument is prohibited except as approved in writing by the superintendent.

Definitions: *Unmanned Aircraft (UAS) is any device that is used or intended to be used for flight in the air without the possibility of direct human intervention from within or on the device, and the associated operational elements and components that are required for the pilot or system operator in command to operate or control the device (such as cameras, sensors, communication links). This term includes all types of devices that meet this definition (e.g., model airplanes, quadcopters, drones) that are used for any purpose, including for recreation commerce.*

Determinations: This restriction is to protect the public from hazards and preserve the park's natural, aesthetic, and scenic values. The use of machine airborne or controlled devices, such as Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) or drones, has the potential to interfere with public safety by posing an in-flight hazard to emergency helicopter use in the park. The use of these devices also has the potential to disrupt wildlife by interrupting migration, nesting, mating, and hunting activities to include, but not limited to, protected species such as the Peregrine Falcon. This restriction is in accordance with NPS Management and view sheds that the park was designated to protect and the associated activities

in which individuals seek solitude and tranquility with an expectation of privacy. Furthermore, the use in designated Wilderness Areas violates the Wilderness Act, which prohibits motorized equipment. An interim measure may be put into place at a later date after the park administration evaluates the appropriateness of this new use on a long-term basis.

§1.6 Permits.

(c) The following permits are required:

1. Research Permits
2. Collection Permits
3. Special Park Use (SPU) Permits

§2.1 Preservation of natural, cultural and archeological resources

(c) With prior approval and/or appropriate permits reasonable quantities of the following may be gathered for personal use or consumption:

- ◆ Prickly pear fruit
- ◆ Buffalo gourd
- ◆ Rose hips
- ◆ Wild plum
- ◆ Choke cherry
- ◆ Apples and other non-native fruits
- ◆ Algeria berries
- ◆ Canutillo (Mormon Tea)

§2.11 Picnicking

Picnicking is prohibited except in designated picnic area.

§2.13 Fires

(a)(1) Open fires are prohibited in all park areas. Self-contained cooking fires may be used but only in designated picnic area.

§2.15 Pets

(e) Park residents may keep pets as long as they are kept under their physical control at all times.

§2.2 Wildlife protection

(d) Lawfully taken wildlife may be transported through the park on state and county roads. However, the transport of weapons must be in compliance with §2.4 of 36 CFR.

§2.21 Smoking

(a) Smoking is prohibited at all times in all park buildings. Smoking is also prohibited on park trails and picnic areas during periods of high fire danger.

§2.35 Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances

(3) (i) Public consumption of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all park areas other than established picnic areas and on residential/easement lands.

§2.51 Public assemblies, meetings


(e) Public assemblies and first amendment activities are restricted to the parking lots at all park units (see attached map).

§2.52 Sale or distribution of printed matter

(e) Sale and distribution of printed matter is restricted to the parking lots at all park units.

§ 2.62 Memorialization

(b) the scattering of human ashes from cremation is prohibited at Salinas Pueblo Missions National Monument. Scattering ashes from cremation is also prohibited because it is inconsistent and interferes with the NPS’s efforts to comply with the National Historic Preservation Act, 16 U.S.C. § 470 *et seq.*, and the Native American Grave Protection and Repatriation Act, 25 U.S.C. § 3001 *et seq.*
