Fees Increase for Three Large Group Campsites at Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks

SEQUOIA AND KINGS CANYON NATIONAL PARKS, CALIFORNIA—Fees for three large group campsites have increased in price at Kings Canyon National Park. The specific campsites (-sites A, C, and D), which accommodate 20-40 people each, are located in the Cedar Grove area at Canyon View Campground. The increase raises the price of each campsite from \$40 per night to \$50 per night to bring the price structure into alignment with other similar large campsites in the parks. The price increases will affect new reservations starting on Monday, July 22, 2013. Reservations may be made up to 6 months in advance by phone at (877) 444-6777 or at www.recreation.gov.
