Activities

Junior Ranger Program

Wildlife is all around us, but often all we see of bears, owls, and bobcats is the scat, tracks, and sign they leave behind. Kids of all ages are welcome to discover what bears eat, owls hunt, or what's been sniffing around your campsite. Saturday and Sunday mornings at the Potwisha campfire circle. 1 hour.

Investigation Station
