Jr. Ranger Round-up



(One hour of hands-on activities)

Sequoia National Park is full of opportunities to explore and learn about the world around us. Come discover what makes this place special and how we can all do our part to enjoy and protect it. Meet at the Potwisha Campground amphitheater.

Investigation Station



(One hour of drop-in activities)

The park's wild plants and animals have wildly different textures, colors, and smells. Examine a cart full of touchable objects at the Foothills Visitor Center. A ranger will be on hand to help you make sense of your observations.

Foothills Feature (15-minute talk)



The oak woodland is one of the most diverse and interesting ecosystems in the world. Meet a ranger at the Foothills Visitor Center for an up-close look at some of our favorite foothills features and creatures.

Evening Program (45-minute talk)



Gather round for an old-fashioned evening with a ranger. Topics vary daily—find today's at the campground ranger station. Meet at Potwisha Campground amphitheater.

Bear Essentials (15-minute talk)



Bears are majestic, adaptable animals, but they have not always been treated with respect, even in the park. Find out what we have learned about bear behavior and get advice on what to do if you see a bear during your visit. Meet outside the visitor center.

Beginner Stargazing (45-minute talk)

Sequoia National Park, with its crystalline skies, is a great place to dive into the Milky Way. Come to Potwisha Campground and learn how to observe the cosmos without a telescope. Meet at the amphitheater.
