



Old Rag day-use ticket

In an effort to alleviate overcrowding and damage to resources, Shenandoah National Park is conducting a pilot program which limits the number of visitors to the Old Rag area. In addition to your entrance fee or pass, **you must have a day-use ticket** to access the Old Rag area including Ridge, Saddle and Ridge Access trails. **Tickets are not available onsite.** Please get your tickets at www.recreation.gov in advance of your arrival. Bringing your pet with you?

Pets must be on a 6-foot physical leash at *all times*. Waste bags should never be left along trails, on trail posts, or in trees. If a trash receptacle is not

immediately available, take the waste bag with you until you find one. Pets are prohibited on the following trails: Fox Hollow, Stony Man, Limberlost, Post Office Junction to Old Rag Shelter, Old Rag Ridge, Old Rag Saddle, Ridge Access, Dark Hollow Falls, Story of the Forest, Bearfence Mountain, and Frazier Discovery.

Pack it in, pack it out.

Keeping food and trash from bears and other animals is essential to their well-being, as well as yours. Shenandoah is too vast to have conveniently placed animal-proof trash receptacles everywhere. You may need to carry your waste with you until you get to an area with receptacles — think lodges, picnic areas, visitor centers, etc. Or, take it home with you!

Tips for Your Visit

- Plan ahead with the official NPS App. **Be sure to download content for offline use before arriving in the Park as coverage is unreliable!** Find out more information at: go.nps.gov/app
- Stay on the hiking trail and never climb around waterfalls.
- Fires are only allowed in park-built grates or fire rings. Fires must be fully extinguished.
- Never leave food or trash unattended, even for a few minutes. Secure all trash in bear-resistant trash cans or dumpsters.
- Drive the posted speed limit and be sure to pull completely off the road when viewing wildlife.
- Don’t rely on your cell phone; coverage is unreliable.
- Try to avoid crowds! If a parking area is full, move on to another trail or overlook.
- Drones are prohibited in all national parks.
- For future visits, get your entrance pass online: recreation.gov/sitepass/74293
- Be aware: cars and bikes share the road. Despite recent changes to Virginia laws, federal regulations require bicyclists to ride single file at all times in Shenandoah National Park.
