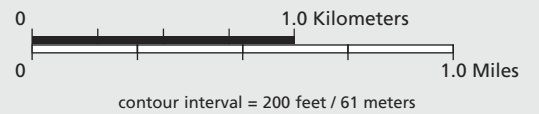

## Suggested Hikes



### Hike #1: Upper and Lower Doyles River Falls

3.3-mile round trip, moderate, 2 1/4 hours hiking time, 1,189-foot elevation gain, 1 stream crossing. Follow Doyles River Trail. Pass the access trails for Doyles River Cabin and Browns Gap Road. Trail posts mark the location of Upper and Lower Doyles River Falls. Retrace your steps to return to the parking lot.



### Hike #2: Doyles River Falls and Jones Run Falls

7.7-mile circuit, strenuous, 6 1/2 hours hiking time, 2,233-foot elevation gain, several stream crossings. Follow Doyles River Trail. Pass the access trails for Doyles River Cabin and Browns Gap Road. Trail posts mark the location of Upper and Lower Doyles River Falls. Another trail post marks the end of Doyles River Trail and the beginning of Jones Run Trail; follow Jones Run Trail. A trail post marks the location of Jones Run Falls. Continue uphill and turn right onto the Appalachian Trail (A.T.) north. The A.T. crosses Skyline Drive twice before it brings you back to Doyles River parking.



### Look for Trail Markers

You'll find these trail markers at all trailheads and intersections. The metal bands are stamped with directional and mileage information.

## Before You Go!

- Pets are not allowed on Fox Hollow Trail. Where allowed, pets must be on a leash at all times.
- Be sure you are physically able to complete the hike you've chosen.
- Take plenty of water—at least a quart per hour.
- Be sure you know your route. Free maps are available at entrance stations, visitor centers, and [www.nps.gov/shen](http://www.nps.gov/shen)
- When you return from your hike, check for ticks.
- Be sure someone knows where you are and when to expect your return.
- Leave what you find. Artifacts are protected by law.
- Please respect family cemeteries.
