- The possession of metal detectors, relic hunting, and possession of archaeological artifacts are prohibited.
- Please do not climb on monuments, fences, or cannon.
- All wildlife is protected. Please enjoy but do not harass.
- Use caution when walking near the steep bluffs along the Tennessee River.
- Drivers please watch for pedestrians on roads.
- Pedestrians should always walk on left side of roadways (towards traffic).
- Bicycles are permitted on paved roads only. Under 16 are required to wear a helmet.
- Skateboards, scooters, one-wheels are not allowed on NPS sites.
- Drones are not allowed on any NPS site.
- Horseback riding is not permitted.
- Pets must be leashed and under control of handler at all times.
- Shiloh United Methodist Church is an active congregation. Park visitors are welcome on privately owned church grounds.
- Grounds close at dark.

#### **Facilities and Resources**



To accommodate visitor needs and to enhance understanding of park resources, the 5,200-acre park offers a variety of facilities and resources.

The visitor center is open 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM, every day except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. The center offers exhibits and a 49-minute film "Shiloh: Fiery Trial" shown on the hour. Accessible restrooms are located inside the visitor center, in the parking lot and picnic area

Rangers are available at the visitor center to greet park visitors, to answer any questions, and to distribute park maps and program schedules.


Across the parking lot from the visitor center, is the park bookstore, operated by Eastern National Park and Monument Association. The store has a large selection of books and interpretive materials, and battlefield maps. Vending machines are located behind the bookstore. It is open from 8:30 am - 5:00 pm during summer hours.

Behind the bookstore is the entrance to the Shiloh National Cemetery. Established in 1866, the ten-

acre cemetery is the final resting place for more than 3,500 Union soldiers, 2 Confederate soldiers, a Revolutionary War soldier, and hundreds who fought in World War I and II, Korea, and Vietnam.

Visitors should allow at least two hours to drive the 12.7 mile, self-guided auto tour route. Pull-offs and interpretive wayside exhibits are located at each of the 22 tour stops. Many of the park's 156 commemorative monuments, 600 troop position markers, and more than 220 cannon can be seen from the park roads. To see all historic structures, one must hike into the surrounding woods and fields.

There is an audio auto driving tour available on the Official NPS App. The NPS App is free to download on your devices.



The park is also home to the Shiloh Indian Mounds National Historic Landmark. This ancient village was believed to have been inhabited between 1050 and 1400 CE. The site has a 1.1 mile hiking trail and wayside exhibits detailing the Indian mound complex. A brochure and map are available on request at the visitor center.

The park's picnic area has a large pavilion, grill, and restroom facilities. It is available for use on a first come, first serve basis. This ten-acre area is located one mile south of the park entrance on Tennessee Highway 22. The area is open daily.

#### Activities

Rangers present 30-minute interpretive programs on weekends in the spring and fall, and daily in the summer. Daily schedules are available in the visitor center and on Facebook.

Special events include battle anniversary living history events, Memorial Day weekend events and services, and a number of demonstrations.


