## THIS IS THE LAST FLOWER LIST OF THE '08 SEASON

Most noticeable flowers in all habitats are asters, goldenrods and Queen Anne's lace. Some of these blossoms may persist until the first frost.

Other flowers noted here are scarce. They usually disappear quite early in October. Still others flowers which aren't on this list may yet be found in solitary places..
