NATIONAL PARK SERVICE TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETINGS TO DISCUSS THE STONEWALL NATIONAL MONUMENT FOUNDATION DOCUMENT

The National Park Service is preparing a foundation document to guide planning and management of Stonewall National Monument. The park welcomes all interested persons to participate in this effort.

A foundation document identifies a national park unit's core purpose and significance, its most important resources and values, and the interpretive themes that tell its unique and significant story. The foundation document will help park staff and the public clearly identify the essential information that is necessary for park management to consider when determining future planning efforts, outlining key planning issues, and protecting resources and values that are integral to park purpose and identity.

The public is invited to attend a public meeting on Tuesday, September 26, 2017 at 6:30 p.m at The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual & Transgender Community Center located at 208 W 13 Street, New York, NY. The meeting will include a formal presentation on the foundation document process and an opportunity to ask questions and submit comments. The National Park Service encourages all interested citizens to play a role in outlining the park's future by sharing their thoughts on what is most important about Stonewall National Monument as well as potential issues that could threaten future preservation and commemoration of the site. The project team will consider public input while developing the plan.
