the regiment participated in skirmishes at Doyal's Plantation on August 5 and at Thompson's Creek on October 5. An enemy raiding party pushed the regiment out of Liberty, Mississippi on November 18 and caused severe losses. After following enemy cavalry that was raiding from Baton Rouge to Pascagoula, Mississippi, in December, the regiment moved into northern Mississippi. The men fought in several skirmishes near Columbus in early 1865. The regiment surrendered May 5, 1865, near Gainesville, Alabama.
