Third Light Artillery. The Third Battery of Light Artillery, was organized at Camp Utley, Racine, WI, and mustered into the service of the United States on October 10, 1861. The battery left the State on the 23rd of January, 1862, proceeding to Louisville, KY. In the early part of March it moved to Nashville, TN, and thence to Savannah, TN. During the summer of that year the battery moved from place to place with the Union forces in the active movements of that year, and participated in the battle of Chaplin Hills or Perryville, KY, October 8, 1862; in the battle of Stone's River, December 30-31 and Jan. 1, 1863; in the Tullahoma Campaign June 23-July 7, 1863, and in the advance upon Chattanooga which followed. Here the battery was assigned to a position in the fortifications, and remained a part of the permanent garrison of that place until the close of the war. In July of 1865, the Third Battery was returned to Madison, and on the 20th day of July, 1865, was mustered out of the service and disbanded.
