

He was assigned to guard the provision stores at Camp Ethridge on 23 June 1862; was left behind in Humboldt on 4 July that year because of illness; died of disease in Nashville on the following 13 November; and is buried in the cemetery there, section A, grave number ~~1,335~~ ⁵⁷²².

Private Christian Johanneson

Private Christian Johanneson of Houston County, Minnesota, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 16 February 1862 and was mustered in on the 25th in Madison. He was 49 years old and married.

He was absent without leave on 20 October 1862 when he disappeared from Crab Orchard on the march to Lebanon, but this was not serious because he was on military police duty on the following 20 December. He was sick and was sent to the convalescent camp at Murfreesboro on 17 May 1863; was sick in the hospital in Chattanooga on 5 November 1864; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside on the following 20 December; and was transferred to the 24th Infantry. He was discharged in Huntsville, Alabama, on 13 March 1865 after his term of service expired.

Private Lars Johanneson

Private Lars Johanneson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 30 September 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was married, but no age is listed.

He served in the bakery in Bowling Green on 3 November 1862; was appointed as a baker in Chattanooga on 16 November 1863 pursuant to orders from General Willich; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Halvor Jørgenson

Private Halvor Jørgenson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 20 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 36 years old and single.

He was left behind in Iuka on 28 August 1862 because of illness; suffered minor wounds at Stones River on 21 December that year and was sent to Nashville; became unfit for service because of illness; and was discharged from Murfreesboro on 7 April 1863.

Private Martin Jørgenson

Private Martin Jørgenson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 32 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862; was seriously wounded at Stones River on the following 31 December and was sent to Nashville; and was then sent to the Navy hospital in Chicago. He was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 15 February 1864.

Musician Niels Juul

Musician Niels Juul of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 23 December 1861 and was mustered in on 4 January 1862 in Madison. He was single, and no age is listed.

He was left behind in Iuka on 20 August 1862 because of illness; deserted on 31 March 1863; was reported to be in Chicago, but by whom is not known; and was struck off as a deserter.

Private Niels Knudsen

Private Niels Knudsen of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He was under arrest on Island Number 10 on 17 May 1862 and escaped from jail the following 11 June. He was not mustered out.

Private Ole Knudsen

Private Ole Knudsen of Winnesheik County, Iowa, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 8 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 27th in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Stones River on 31 December 1862, but returned after a while; was sick and became unfit for service; and was therefore discharged on 8 November 1863.

Private Lars Kydland

Private Lars Kydland of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 32 years old and married.

He was sick in St. Louis; was detached to serve as an orderly in the general hospital in the Jefferson Barracks in St. Louis on 4 March 1862; was sick and became unfit for service; and was therefore discharged on 27 June 1863.

Private Andreas Larson

Private Andreas Larson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 30 September 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 38 years old and married.

He was in the convalescent camp near Murfreesboro for a while in 1863 and was transferred to the Navy on 6 May 1864.

Private Andrew Solla Larson

Private Andrew Solla Larson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 15 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 18th in Madison. He was 27 years old and single; had blue eyes, blond hair and fair skin; stood 5' 5-1/2" tall; and was a smith.

He deserted from the Regiment near Springfield, Illinois, while they were on the way to St. Louis. He was not mustered out.

Private Ole Larson

Private Ole Larson of Winnesheik County, Iowa, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 8 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 27th in Madison. He was 18 years old and single; had blue eyes, blond hair, and fair skin; stood 5' 7-1/2" tall; and was a farmer.

He was fatally wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville. He died in the hospital at Murfreesboro on 26 March 1863 and was buried in the national cemetery at Stones River, section ^C~~8~~, grave number ¹⁰⁹⁴~~105~~. He was moved there from Murfreesboro.

Private Svend Larson

Private Svend Larson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 27 September 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 42 years old and married; had blue eyes, blond hair, and fair skin; stood 6' 2" tall; and was a sailor.

He was given home leave from Madison on 29 December 1861, but he never came back. He was struck off as a deserter.

Private Elias Lodgaard

Private Elias Lodgaard of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 9 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 18th in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was assigned to hospital service in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; was an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was absent because of illness on 24 January 1864; was taken prisoner at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864; and died of illness in Andersonville the following 29 October. He was buried there in grave number 9,997.

Private Ole J. Lorensen

Private Ole J. Lorensen of Chicago enlisted (under whom is not recorded) on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 43 years old and married.

He became unfit for service because of illness and was therefore discharged in Nashville on 15 December 1862.

Private Herman Lundgren

Private Herman Lundgren of Winnesheik County, Iowa, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 31 August 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 45 years old and married.

He was transferred to [from?] Company D on Island Number 10; was left behind in Humboldt on 4 July 1862 because of illness; was sick in Iuka on the following 21 August; was sick in the hospital in Lebanon, Kentucky, on the following 27 October; was sick in Nashville on 11 November 1863; was sick on the 28th of that month (in Quincy, Illinois); became unfit for service; and was discharged in Nashville on 20 January 1864.

Private John (M.) Lundgren

Private John (M.) Lundgren of Chicago enlisted (under whom is not listed) on 25 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 17 years old and single.

He was shot through the left arm at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864, was sent to the hospital, and was later sent to the North. He was discharged from Harvey Hospital in Madison, Wisconsin, on 17 December 1864 because of his wounds.

Private Andrew Luraas

Private Andrew Luraas of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 17 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He died of disease in Mound City, Illinois, on 10 April 1862.

Private Anton Monsen

Private Anton Monsen of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 27 December 1861 and was mustered in on 1 January 1862 in Madison. He was 30 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862; was sick in the hospital in Lebanon, Kentucky, on 27 October 1862; became unfit for service because of illness; and was discharged in Quincy, Illinois, on 18 April 1863.

Private Lorents Nielson

Private Lorents Nielson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 25 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 30 years old and single.

He was left behind at Stones River on 31 December 1862 because of illness and was sent to the hospital in Nashville; was sick in the Naval Hospital in Chicago on 31 November 1863; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps.

Private Jonas Norem

Private Jonas Norem of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 9 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at La Vergne, Tennessee, on 29 December 1862; was exchanged on 29 June 1863; was absent with the division quartermaster's supply train on 17 January 1864; was on detached service in Chattanooga the following 5 October; and was discharged from there on 20 December 1864.

Private Peter Norman

Private Peter Norman of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 8 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He died in Bowling Green on 22 November 1862 and is buried in the cemetery in Nashville, section N, grave number 480. ¹⁰⁶⁸⁹

Private Aanun Olson

Private Aanun Olson of Jefferson County, Wisconsin, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 28 January and was mustered in on the 31st in Madison. He was 45 years old; had blue eyes, blond hair, and fair skin; stood 5' 10" tall; and was a farmer.

He was left behind in Iuka on 21 August 1862 because of illness, died of chronic diarrhea in the hospital in Nashville on 27 July 1863, and is buried in the cemetery there, section C, grave number ¹⁷³⁹⁰ 393.

Private Amund Olson

Private Amund Olson of Bad Ax County enlisted under Captain Ingmundson on 14 November 1861 and was mustered in on 17 December in Madison. He was 20 years old.

He was sick in the hospital in Mound City, Illinois, whence he was given leave (in 1862?); was absent without leave; was sick in Bardstown, Kentucky, on 8 October 1862; was wounded in the Battle of Chickamauga on 20 September 1863 and was sent to the hospital in Chattanooga; was sick in the camp hospital on 11 July 1864; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Knud Olson

Private Knud Olson, recruit, from Pleasant Springs, enlisted under Lieutenant Baker on 16 January 1864 and was mustered in that month in Madison. He was 36 years old.

He joined the company at McDonald's Station on 23 April 1864; was shot through the left hand at Resaca, Georgia, on the following 14 May and was sent to the hospital; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside on the following 20 December; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; was sick in Huntsville, Alabama, on 3 March 1865; and was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June that year.

Private Michael Olson

Private Michael Olson of Bad Ax County enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 16 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 20th in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was absent because of illness on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862 and died in Chicago on the following 28 July.

Private Niels P. Olson

Private Niels P. Olson of Bad Ax County enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 16 November 1861 and was mustered in on 10 December in Madison. He was 36 years old and married.

He was sick in Chattanooga from 7 October until 28 November 1863 and was mustered out with the company.

Private Olaf Olson

Private Olaf Olson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 8 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He was in jail on Island Number 10 on 17 May 1862; was sick in Nashville; and was transferred to the Navy in the vicinity of Ringgold, Georgia, on 5 May 1864.

Private Ellef Pederson

Private Ellef Pederson of Chicago enlisted (under whom is not given) on 11 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 29 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Mound City, Illinois, in 1862; was given leave from there; was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green on 17 September that year; became unfit for service because of illness; and was discharged in Louisville, Kentucky, on 28 July 1863.

Sergeant Amund Peterson

Sergeant Amund Peterson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 26 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison; —.

He was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862; went his own way from the hospital in West End, Cincinnati, Ohio; returned to the company; was taken prisoner at the Battle of Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; and on the orders of the post commander was discharged because of his wounds in Chicago on 28 July 1864.

Private Knud Peterson

Private Knud Peterson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 9 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 28 years old and single.

He was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville, where he died of his wounds on 13 April 1863. He is buried in the Nashville cemetery, section D, grave number ~~418~~³³⁶².

In his book about the Regiment, Johnson mentions a name—Kempt Peterson, Company A—which is not listed in the Rolls. According to the same authority, this Kempt was entered on the Roll of Honor for the 2nd Brigade (20th Army Corps). Knud and Kempt must be the same man, but since an incorrect name was entered on the Roll of Honor, naturally none of this honor has been attached to Knud's name.

Private Thomas Sampson

Private Thomas Sampson of Boone County, Illinois, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 9 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 on 23 May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Private Samuel Sampson

Private Samuel Sampson of Boone County, Illinois, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 16 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 on 30 May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery.

Sergeant Arnoldus Schlambush

Sergeant Arnoldus Schlambush of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 26 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was single and no age is listed.

He was taken prisoner at Stones River on 31 December 1862; came to St. Louis on parole; was absent on recruiting duty on 21 November 1863; and was transferred to the Navy on 6 May 1864 in the vicinity of Ringgold, Georgia. He is entered on the Roll of Honor for the 2nd Brigade, 20th Army Corps.

Private Gabriel E. Somme

Private Gabriel E. Somme of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 24 December 1861 and was mustered in on 1 January 1862 in Madison. He was 22 years old and married.

He was seriously wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to Nashville; was in the convalescent camp in Murfreesboro on 17 May 1863; was sick in Knoxville on 14 January 1864; was sick in Chattanooga on the following 2 May; and was reported sick at various times during the summer of 1864, the last time at the hospital in Jeffersonville, Indiana. He was not discharged.

Private Gabriel J. Somme

Private Gabriel J. Somme of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 5 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 43 years old and single.

He went missing at the Battle of Stones River on 31 December 1862, but returned to the Regiment; was sick in Knoxville on 28 November 1863; was sick there again on 24 February 1864; was taken prisoner at the Battle of New Hope Church on 27 May 1864; was later reported as a prisoner of war; and was mustered out in Madison, Wisconsin, on 1 January 1865, effective from 6 December the previous year.

Private Henry Sporland

Private Henry Sporland of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 11 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 29 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862 and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 15 August 1864.

Private Oliver Stall

Private Oliver Stall of Boone County, Illinois, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 17 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was never reported absent and was mustered out with the company.

Private Andreas Svendsen

Private Andreas Svendsen of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 27 September 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was married, but no age is listed.

He was sick and had leave on 7 May 1862; was sick on Iuka the following 21 August; was sick in the hospital in Lebanon on 27 October that year; became unfit for service; and was discharged in Louisville on 16 February 1863.

Sergeant Henry Syvertsen

Sergeant Henry Syvertsen of Chicago enlisted under ——— on 20 February 1862 and was mustered in on the 27th in Madison. He was 28 years old and single.

He was sick in Nashville on 26 December 1862; was appointed as clerk in the brigade hospital on 4 May 1863; was sick in Stevenson, Alabama, on the following 27 August; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps some time later. He was mustered out of Company 97 in the 2nd Battery of the Veteran Reserve Corps in Lexington, Kentucky, on 28 February 1865; his term of service had expired.

Private Isak Syverson

Private Isak Syversen [*sic*] of La Crosse enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 3 January 1862 and was mustered in on the eighth in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was a wagoner for a long time; was with the quartermaster in Chattanooga on 29 November 1863 and with the division supply train a few days later; was with the quartermaster's supply train on 17 January 1864; was on detached service in Chattanooga on 5 October 1864; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Jacob Syvertsen

Private Jacob Syvertsen of Madison enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 26 December 1861 and was mustered in on 11 January 1862. He had blue eyes, red hair, and fair skin; stood 5' 10" tall; and was a farmer.

He served as a smith with the quartermaster in Chattanooga and was killed at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864.

Private Ole Syver[t]sen

Private Ole Syvertsen of La Crosse enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 10 January 1861 and was mustered in on the 27th in Madison. He was 37 years old and single.

He served with the military police on 22 and 24 December 1862; became ill and was sent to the hospital in Murfreesboro; became unfit for service because of illness; and was therefore discharged on 5 May 1863.

Corporal Ditleff Tharaldson

Corporal Ditleff Tharaldson of Janesville, Wisconsin, enlisted under Captain Putnam on 30 December (1863) and was mustered in on the same day. He was 21 years old.

He joined the company as a recruit at Strawberry Plains; was transferred to Company H on 20 December; was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps at Whiteside on 20 January 1865; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and was transferred finally to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Jonas Thompson

Private Jonas Thompson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson and was mustered in on 15 November 1861 in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was assigned to guard duty over the commissary stores at Camp Ethridge on 23 June 1862; was seriously wounded at Stones River on 31 December that year and was sent to Nashville; was sick there again on 31 May, 31 July and 11 November 1863; and was discharged on 19 February 1864. He is entered on the Roll of Honor.

Private Lewis Thompson

Private Lewis Thompson of Boone County, Illinois, enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 16 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 in May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Corporal Thomas Thompson

Corporal Thomas Thompson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 27 September 1861 and was mustered in on 8 January 1862 in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was sick in Chattanooga on 28 and 29 November 1863; was transferred to the Navy in the vicinity of Ringgold, Georgia, on 6 May 1864; and is entered on the Roll of Honor for the bravery he displayed during the Battle of Stones River. In 1893 he was living in Winekonne [sic], Wisconsin.

Wagoner Georg Wagoner

Wagoner Georg Wagoner of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on ——— and was mustered in on 15 November 1861 in Madison. He was 28 years old and single; had brown eyes, black hair, and fair skin; stood 6' 1" tall; and was a tailor.

He deserted from the company on 3 March 1862 on the way from Springfield, Illinois, to St. Louis, Missouri; he was never mustered out.

This company was mustered out in Chattanooga, Tennessee, on 20 December 1864.

Company B
Term of service: 3 years

Captain Joseph Mathisen

Captain Joseph Mathisen of Madison, Wisconsin, enlisted as a private and was mustered in on 16 November 1861; he was promoted from private to 1st lieutenant the same fall. He was 22 years old and single.

On 18 December 1862 he was promoted to captain with rank from 1 November. He was mustered out with the company in Chattanooga on 1 December 1864.

Mathisen was born in Copenhagen, Denmark, on 7 January 1840 and received a good education. He came to America in 1859 and when the war broke out he enlisted in the 1st Regiment of Wisconsin Volunteers for three months. When his term of service expired he returned to Wisconsin and enlisted in the 15th, and he took part in all the battles the Regiment was in.

He has been a successful businessman and at the time this was written he was the treasurer[#] of the Bank of Evansville in Evansville, Minnesota.

1st Lieutenant Ole G. Thompson

First Lieutenant Ole G. Thompson of Chicago enlisted under Captain Torkildson on 27 September 1861 and was mustered in on 8 January 1862 in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He belonged to Company A, where he was named 1st sergeant; was promoted to 1st lieutenant in Company B on 1 November 1862; became unfit for service because of illness; and resigned on 30 January 1863.

O. G. Thompson was born in Voss in 1841 and came to America with his parents in 1853. The following year he began working at the *Chicago Journal's* press, where he worked as a typographer until 1861 when he went off to war. There he suffered greatly from diarrhea and thereby became completely unfit for service—just like so many other comrades. He was given leave and went home, and soon he became healthy enough that he returned in time for the Battle of Stones River. But the hardships he had had to endure resulted in the return of the illness, and if he wanted to survive he would have to abandon the war, said the doctor.

By living carefully he managed to regain his health, and since then he has held various positions of honor in Chicago, among them police inspector.[#]

1st Lieutenant Ole R. Dahl

First Lieutenant Ole R. Dahl of Bloomer Prairie, Chippewa County, Wisconsin, enlisted under Captain Sime on 29 October 1861 and was mustered in on 13 February 1862 in Madison. He was 44 years old —.

He was promoted from 1st sergeant in Company H to 1st lieutenant in Company B on 3 May 1863, and in the meantime he was a clerk for a while for the quartermaster on Island Number 10. He served as a topographical engineer in the 2nd Brigade in March 1863; the same in the 3rd Brigade the following May; and the same in the 1st Brigade, 3rd Division the next October; was taken prisoner near Morristown, East Tennessee, on 18 March 1864; and was mustered out on 12 March 1865.

Ole Rasmussen Dahl was born in Kristianssund parish, Nordmøre, Norway, on 19 July 1817. When he was 17 years old he went to sea, but nine months later Fredøe congregation chose

him as their school teacher and got the money so he could get further education. After attending school for a time in Kristianssund he received his *Eksamen* from Pastors Schaaning and Holterman and was himself a teacher for a couple of years. He then resigned and joined the Thingvald company of the Romsdal Band. He later went to noncommissioned officer's training in Trondhjem, where he also learned surveying, etc., and after a couple of years received his *Eksamen* with the mark of "outstandingly good" and a prize. He got married and was transferred to the Trondhjem Band, but it was difficult to support his family and he therefore requested a discharge and left for America in 1854, while his family had to stay behind in Norway. He settled in Chippewa County, Wisconsin, and in two years he again had his family with him. He was well-liked and several times held offices in the town. In 1861 he received a recruiting commission for a company and thought he would be named captain; but this did not happen so he shouldered his rifle and joined as a private. He was certainly much too capable a man to be ignored—for long. Brigade Commander Colonel Cadlin was made aware of his abilities as a topographer. On the march and otherwise he usually mapped the roads and various other places, etc., and then he was temporarily appointed as a topographer, named 1st lieutenant, and transferred to the Staff. As a topographical engineer he earned a distinguished reputation not just among his fellow engineers, but among the higher-ranking officers and generals in the Cumberland Army. A framed drawing of the battlefield at Stones River hangs in the adjutant general's office in the capitol in Madison, Wisconsin, and this is regarded as the most reliable drawing that was made.

He became a prisoner of war while he was serving beyond the picket lines in the spring of 1864, but he continued with his drawings; now it was drawings of prisons and scenes of prison life that occupied his time until he was exchanged and mustered out.

After the war he was employed by the state to supervise the large tracts of forest; he lived in Thomah [sic] then. He was ill a great deal for the last seven years of his life, and he died on 30 December 1882.

2nd Lieutenant Ole P. Olson

Second Lieutenant Ole P. Olson enlisted under ——— on 23 September 1861 and was mustered in, in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was immediately named sergeant and on 18 December 1862 he was promoted to 2nd lieutenant with rank from the previous 1 November. He became unfit for service and was discharged on 22 June 1863.

He was a conscientious man and looked after his company well, but on the difficult marches his feet were seriously injured and he therefore had to resign.

Noncommissioned Officers and Privates

Private Anders C. Anderson

Private Anders C. Anderson of Madison enlisted under Captain Johnson on 5 March 1862 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 33 years old and single.

He became unfit for service and was discharged on 22 June 1862.

Private Andrew E. Anderson

Private Andrew E. Anderson of Deerfield enlisted under Captain Grinager on 15 March 1864 and was mustered in on the following 20 April in Madison. He was 20 years old —.

He joined the company at Dallas, Georgia; was transferred to Company H; and was transferred to Company K in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Halvor Anderson

Private Halvor Anderson of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 10 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He died of disease in the hospital on Island Number 10 on 25 May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Private Jens Anderson

Private Jens Anderson of Berlin, Green Lake County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 8 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

In accordance with Colonel Heg's orders he was absent with the 8th Wisconsin Battery in July 1863. He was not mustered out with the company, but re-enlisted under Captain Stiles, 8th Battery, in Nashville on 5 January 1864.

Private Nels Anderson

Private Nels Anderson of Koshkonong enlisted under Captain Johnson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Murfreesboro; was wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863, and was sent to Chattanooga, then to the North. He was mustered out with the company.

Private Ole Anderson

Private Ole Anderson (No. 1) of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 22 October 1861 and was mustered in on 26 November in Madison. He was 18 years old

He was sick in Bardstown, Kentucky, on 6 October 1862 and became unfit for service; he was therefore discharged on the following 16 December.

Private Ole Anderson

Private Ole Anderson (No. 2) of Door Creek, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on — and was mustered in on 11 December 1861 in Madison. He was 32 years old and single.

He disappeared at the Battle of Chickamauga on 20 September 1863; was later discovered to be a prisoner of war in Richmond on 5 November 1863 that year; and died as a prisoner in Danville, Virginia, on 24 April 1864. He is buried in an anonymous grave in the cemetery there.

Private Ole Anderson

Private Ole Anderson (No. 3) of Dunkirk, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Grinager on 28 December 1863 and was mustered in on 28 January 1864 in Madison. He was 35 years old —.

He joined the company at McDonald's Station, Tennessee; was transferred to Company H on the following 1 December; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry.

Private Syver A. Anderson

Private Syver A. Anderson of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 22 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville, became unfit for service, and was discharged in Louisville, Kentucky, on 18 September 1863.

Private Kittel Aanunson

Private Kittel Aanunson of Winchester, Winnebago County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 24 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He was sick in the general hospital on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862; became unfit for service; was discharged the following 6 October; and later enlisted in Company A, 47th Wisconsin Infantry.

Private Erik Asbjörnson

Private Erik Asbjörnson of La Crosse enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 23 December 1863 and was mustered in there on 26 December. He was 40 years old —.

He joined the company in Knoxville on 19 February 1864; was transferred to Company H on the following 1 December; was later transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry.

Private Andrew Asperheim

Private Andrew Asperheim of Windsor, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 22 December 1862 and was mustered in the same day in Madison. He was 27 years old —; had blue eyes, blond hair, and fair skin; and stood 5' 7" tall.

He was a wagoner for a time with the division supply train; was taken prisoner in La Vergne, Tennessee, on 29 December 1862; was on parole in St. Louis on the 31st of that month; was shot through the body at Resaca on 14 May 1864; and died in the hospital that day.

Private E. N. Barsnes

Private Erik Nilson Barsnes of Koshkonong enlisted under Captain Johnson on 22 December 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

The reports about him do not agree, but they show that he was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 (and taken prisoner?); was in the convalescent camp at Murfreesboro on 7 May 1863 (this must be wrong, since he was in the parole camp in St. Louis on the following 30 June); and was mustered out with the company.

Sergeant Harvey Britton

Sergeant Harvey Britton of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was promoted from Company C to 1st sergeant on 1 January 1863; was taken prisoner at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864; died of disease in Andersonville on the following 11 October; and is buried there in grave number 10,658.

Private Anders J. Burke (Bjørke?)

Private Anders J. Burke (Bjørke?) of Koshkonong enlisted under Captain Johnson on 8 February 1862 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He was sick in the convalescent camp at Murfreesboro on 7 May 1863; was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 4 October that year under the name of Andrew Burry; and was mustered out from Company G in the 11th Regiment of the Veteran Reserve Corps on 8 February 1865. In 1893 he was living in Urness, Minnesota.

Private Ole O. Burke (Bjørke?)

Private Ole Olson Burke (Bjørke?) of La Crosse enlisted under Captain Johnson on 23 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 30 years old and single.

He became ill and was sent to the general hospital in Jacinto, Mississippi, on 20 July 1862; was sick in Nashville on 26 December that year; was taken prisoner at the Battle of Chickamauga on 20 September 1863; and died in Andersonville on 11 June 1864. He is buried there in grave number 1,838.

Private Anders Christopherson

Private Anders Christopherson of Halfway Creek enlisted under Neumeister on 26 August 1862 and was mustered in there on the 28th. He was 29 years old.

He served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was transferred to Company H on 1 December 1864; and was then transferred to the 24th Infantry on 13 February 1865.

Sergeant Carl L. Colbjörnson

Sergeant Carl L. Colbjörnson of Madison enlisted under Captain Johnson on 26 August 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November. He was 29 years old and single.

He became ill and unfit for service, and was therefore discharged in Murfreesboro on 23 March 1863.

Private Christen O. Dahle

Private Christen O. Dahle of McFarland, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 4 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 13th in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He died of dysentery in the hospital in Murfreesboro on 2 July 1863 and is buried in the national cemetery at Stones River, section ^F~~D~~, grave number ²⁶²⁸~~409~~.

Private Anders [sic] Ellefson

Private Andreas Ellefson of Mt. Morris, Waushara County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 25 November 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10 in June 1862; likewise in Bowling Green in June 1863 and in Tullahoma the following July; was taken prisoner at the Battle of Chickamauga; and died as a prisoner of war in Richmond on 26 April 1864. He is buried in the cemetery in Danville.

Private Anders Erikson

Private Anders Erikson of Door Creek, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 11 September 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He served as an orderly in Hospital No. 2 at Murfreesboro from 1 March 1863 and was mustered out with the company.

Private Knud Erikson

Private Knud Erikson of Neshonot [Neshonoc], La Crosse County, enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 5 January 1864 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 36 years old.

He joined the company in Knoxville on the following 19 February; was wounded at New Hope Church and sent to the hospital; and was transferred to Company H, then to the 24th Infantry, and finally on 10 June 1865 to the 13th Infantry.

Private C. Erickson

Private Christopher Erickson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 3 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Jacinto in July 1862, likewise the same month in Farmington in the same state; was taken prisoner at the Battle of Chickamauga; died in Andersonville on 19 August 1864; and is buried in the cemetery there in grave number 6,160.

Private Louis Erickson

Private Louis Erickson of La Crosse enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 17 February 1864 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 18 years old.

He entered as a recruit for a man in Buffalo City; joined the company at Knoxville; became ill the following 13 July; and was transferred to Company H, then to the 24th Infantry, and then on 10 June 1865 to Company K in the 13th Infantry.

Private Carl E. Evenson

Private Carl E. Evenson of Madison enlisted under Captain Johnson on 3 March 1862 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 26 years old.

Drummer — was transferred to the Staff on 17 December 1862, but was demoted and transferred to Company B as a private; served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 20 June and 13 October 1863; served on military police duty on 20 April 1864; was sick in the hospital on 2 July that year; was transferred to Company H at Lookout Creek, then to the 24th Infantry; and was discharged in Huntsville, Alabama, on 13 March 1865 when his term of service had expired.

Private Hans Fæstad

Private Hans Fæstad of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 26 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was taken prisoner at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864; was reported as a prisoner of war on parole at the Benton Barracks on 16 January 1865, and was mustered out in Madison on the following 13 February.

Private John H. Fæstad

Private John H. Fæstad of Stoughton enlisted on 26 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 23 years old and single.

He died of disease in the hospital in Nashville on 23 December 1862 and is buried in the cemetery there, section B, grave number ~~314~~ ⁵⁹¹⁷.

Private Peder O. Froynees

Private Peder O. Froynees of Pleasant Spring, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 47 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Nashville in September 1862, became unfit for service, and was discharged on 19 December that year.

Private John Gilbertson

Private John Gilbertson of Gale, Trempeleau County, enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 21 January 1864 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 37 years old.

He joined the company in Knoxville; was seriously wounded at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864 and was sent to the hospital, then to the North; and was discharged on 29 July 1865 because of the wound in his left leg.

Private Halvor Halvorson

Private Halvor Halvorson of Winchester, Wisconsin, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 6 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 18th in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10 in June 1862 and died in the hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio, on 3 August that year. He is buried in Spring Grove Cemetery there, section B, grave number 66.

Private Lars Halvorson

Private Lars Halvorson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 23 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 on 25 May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Private Ludvig L. H. Hauge

Private Ludvig L. H. Hauge of Sterling, Bad Ax County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 25 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 27th in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; was a wagoner with the supply train[#] on 1 October 1863, likewise with the ambulance on 28 June 1864 and subsequently; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Søren L. H. Hauge

Private Søren L. H. Hauge of Sterling, Bad Ax County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 14 December 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was a wagoner; was sick in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; was sick on 23 and 25 July 1864; and was mustered out with the company.

Sergeant Lars Hannibal

Sergeant Lars Hannibal of Merton, Waukesha County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 28 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 40 years old and single.

He was sick in Iuka on 21 August 1862, became unfit for service; and was discharged in Nashville on 21 December that year. (One reports records the date of discharge as 2 December.)

Corporal Christen Hanson

Corporal Christen Hanson of Merton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 13 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 29 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Iuka on 21 August 1862; was sick in Nashville on the following 8 and 10 December; was left behind with the supply train on 11 September 1863 because of illness; was reported sick on 24 December 1864 after the mustering out; and was not mustered out with the company.

Private C. Hansen

Private Christen Hansen of Manitowoc enlisted under Captain Johnson on 25 November 1861 and was mustered in on 1 December in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10; was left behind in Iuka on 21 August 1862 because of illness; was sick in the hospital in Jacinta and in Farmington, Mississippi, in July that year; became unfit for service; and was discharged in Cincinnati, Ohio, on the following 11 October.

Private Lars Hanson

Private Lars Hanson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 15 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 28 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 20 September 1863 and died in Andersonville on 3 September 1864, where he is buried in grave number 7,649.

Private Hans Hendrickson

Private Hans Hendrickson of Madison enlisted under Captain Johnson on 8 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th. He was 23 years old and single.

He was transferred to the 68th Indiana at Maryville, Tennessee, on 31 January 1864, but was transferred back at Strawberry Plain on 20 July of that year. He was mustered out with the company.

Private Christoffer Hoff

Private Christoffer Hoff of Christiana, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 10 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 39 years old and married.

He was in the Pioneer Corps in November 1862 and was mustered out with the company.

Musician Jørgen Isackson

Musician Jørgen Isackson of Mt. Morris enlisted under Captain Johnson on 25 November 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

Drummer ... was transferred to the Staff on 1 May 1862; was demoted in Nashville on 1 September that year; was sick in Chattanooga on 24 November 1863; was taken prisoner in Knoxville on 1 January 1864; died as a prisoner of war on the following 20 March; and is buried in the cemetery in Richmond, Virginia.

Private Jacob Jacobson

Private Jacob Jacobson of Milwaukee enlisted under Trowbridge on 20 August 1862 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 44 years old and a sailor.

He was wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and was sent to the hospital in Chattanooga, then to the North. He was discharged from Harvey Hospital in Madison on 20 September 1864 because of his wounds.

Drummer Engel Johnson

Drummer Engel Johnson of Leads, Columbia County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 24 September [1861?] and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was never reported sick or absent, and was mustered out with the company. In 1892 he was living in Sherman, Lincoln County, Washington.

Private John Johnson

Private John Johnson of Door Creek, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 11 December 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10; was sick in the hospital in Iuka on 21 August 1862; and was wounded and taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863. From this point on the reports are at odds, but the corrected ones show that he is buried in Marietta, section A, grave number 118, and that he was transported there from Atlanta.

Private John H. Johnson

Private John H. Johnson of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 7 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Private Ole Knudson

Private Ole Knudson of Jackson, La Crosse County, enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 5 January 1864 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 33 years old.

He joined the company at Knoxville and was killed at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864.

Private Østen Knudson

Private Østen Knudson of Winchester, Winnebago County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 19 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 25th in Madison. He was 19 years old (entered as 21).

He was killed in the Battle of New Hope Church on 27 May 1864.

Private Hans A. Lageson

Private Hans A. Lageson of Alamakee, Iowa, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 18 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 27th in Madison. He was 23 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862; served on military police duty on 17, 20 and 24 December that year; was wounded and taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; was exchanged and absent because of illness; and was discharged from Harvey Hospital in Madison on 23 January 1865 because of his wounds. Letters from him are included elsewhere.

Sergeant J. Larkee

Sergeant John Larkee of Neenah enlisted under Captain Johnson on 24 October 1861 and was mustered in on 15 December in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He was sick on Island Number 10 in June and in Iuka in August of 1862, and ran away from Iuka on the 21st, but was brought back to Jackson, Tennessee, on 14 November that year. He was sick, became unfit for service, and was discharged as a private the day after his return.

Private Edwin Larson

Private Edwin Larson of Madison enlisted under T. S. West on 8 September 1862. He was 32 years old and a sailor.

He was absent without leave on 31 December 1862 (that is, during the Battle of Stones River), and was discharged in Murfreesboro because of disability on 3 April 1863.

Corporal Erick Larson

Corporal Erick Larson of Deerfield enlisted under Captain Johnson on 22 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 24 years old.

He served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was wounded at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864 (shot through the head and shoulder); and died of his wounds on the following 22 June. He is buried in the national cemetery in Chattanooga in section E, grave number ¹¹⁴⁴⁵248.

Corporal Jens Larson

Corporal Jens Larson of Columbus, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 10 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He died of disease in the Regimental Hospital in Nashville on 22 November 1862 and is buried in the cemetery there.

Private Mads Larson

Private Mads Larson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 13 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; was taken prisoner at Chickamauga; died in Andersonville on 1 September 1864; and is buried in grave number 7,532.

Corporal P. O. Larson

Corporal Peter O. Larson of Coon Prairie enlisted under Captain Johnson on 23 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and came to the hospital in Nashville; became unfit for service; and was discharged in Louisville, Kentucky, on 4 April 1863.

Private Stark Larson

Private Stark Larson of Pleasant Spring, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 23 October 1861 and was mustered in on 20 November in Madison. He was 36 years old and single.

He was left behind because of illness on Island Number 10 in June 1862; was sick in the hospital in Iuka the following August; became unfit for service; and was discharged in Quincy, Illinois, on 11 May 1863.

Private R. Lasseson

Private Rognald Lasseson of Christiana, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 23 October 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 29 years old and single.

He died of nervous fever in Murfreesboro on 6 April 1863 and is buried in the national cemetery at Stones River, section ⁰ 1, grave number ⁵⁸²⁶ 228.

Private Sophus Listoe

Private Sophus Listoe of La Crosse enlisted under Captain Johnson on 1 September 1862 and was mustered in on the following 2 November. He was 20 years old and single.

He was sick in Nashville on 8 and 10 December 1862, became unfit for service, and was discharged on 23 February 1863.

Sergeant Bernt J. Madson

Sergeant Bernt J. Madson of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 1 October 1861 and was mustered in on 18 January 1862 in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; was a prisoner in Richmond; and was mustered out in Madison on 27 January 1865, effective from the 11th.

Bernhard Madson (or Bernt, as he is entered in the Rolls) was born in Lillehammer, Norway, on 18 August 1840 and is the son of Doctor Bernhard Madson. He came to America in 1848 and settled in Cambridge, Dane County, Wisconsin.

Private Ole Mickelson

Private Ole Mickelson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 8 November 1861 and was mustered in on 12 December in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He died of disease in the hospital in Jacinto on 10 August 1862 and is buried in the cemetery in Corinth, Mississippi.

Corporal T. Mikkelson

Corporal Torgrim Mikkelson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 17 October 1861 and was mustered in on 20 November in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He was killed in the Battle of Stones River on 31 December 1862 and is buried in the national cemetery there, section ^LH, grave number ⁴⁶⁷⁹97.

Corporal K. J. Mjelde

Corporal Knud J. Mjelde enlisted under Captain Johnson on 14 September 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th. He was 29 years old and married.

He was sick on Island Number 10 in June 1862; was given leave and stayed away too long; was sick and became unfit for service; and was discharged in Madison on 18 November that year.

Private Jens O. Moe

Private Jens Olson Moe of Columbus, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 19 February 1862 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 23 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 on 19 May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Private Iver Monson

Private Iver Monson of Christiana, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 11 January 1862 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was sick at home in the town of Christiana in February 1862, deserted, and was found again on 9 November 1863. He was court-martialed, found guilty, and sentenced to forfeit all pay and compensation from 1 November 1861 until 1 September 1863, and was discharged on 2 December 1864. He was therefore present for the Regiment's final marches and battles in the last year. He has been a successful farmer in De Forest in Dane County for a long time.

Private Torger Monson

Private Torger Monson of Washington, La Crosse County, enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 25 February 1864 and was mustered in on the same day in La Crosse. He was 44 years old.

He joined the company at Strawberry Plains on 31 March 1864 and was transferred to Company H, then to the 24th Infantry, and finally on 10 June 1865 to Company I in the 13th Infantry.

Private Albert A. Nilson

Private Albert A. Nilson of Pleasant Spring enlisted under Captain Johnson on 12 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862; the reports do not agree about whether he was taken prisoner. It is said that he was sent to Nashville, but it is also said that he was taken prisoner and was exchanged in St. Louis and in Annapolis, Maryland. In any case he was back in the lines on 13 October 1863 because he was with the provision transport from Stevenson. He was mustered out with the company.

Private Andrew Nelson

Private Andrew Nelson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 17 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 23 years old and single.

He died of disease in the hospital in Winchester, Tennessee, on 4 August 1863.

Private Lewis Nelson

Private Lewis Nelson of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 11 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single; had blue eyes, brown hair, and a dark complexion; and stood 5' 8" tall.

He suffered minor wounds at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to Nashville; was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 20 September 1863; and returned one way or another because he was killed at Kennesaw Mountain on 28 June 1864 and is buried in the cemetery in Marietta, Georgia, section G, grave number 1,449.

Private Ole Nelson

Private Ole Nelson of Koshkonong enlisted under Captain Johnson on 8 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was sick in Union City, Tennessee, from 14 to 19 June 1862 and was sick in the hospital in St. Louis in January 1863, where he became unfit for service. He was discharged on the following 27 July.

Private Rasmus Nelson

Private Rasmus Nelson of Hartland, Waukesha County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 8 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862, likewise on the following 4 November, and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 9 April 1864.

Private Christian Nelson

Private Christian Nelson of Hartland, Waukesha County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 28 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 23 years old and married.

He was absent from the general hospital in Jacinto on 28 July 1862 because of illness; was sick in the hospital in Farmington, Mississippi, on the same day; became unfit for service; and was discharged in Cincinnati, Ohio, on 22 October that year.

Sergeant Ole A. Nordbye

Sergeant Ole A. Nordbye of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 10 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 34 years old and married.

He was left behind in Iuka on 21 August 1862 because of illness and ran off the same day, but he was found and discharged as unfit for service in Jackson, Tennessee, on the following 29 October.

Private Nels Olavus

Private Nels Olavus of Winchester, Winnebago County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 6 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 18th in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 20 September 1863 and was sent to Richmond; was exchanged; was sick in Annapolis, Maryland, and in Louisville, Kentucky; and was mustered out in Madison on 18 January 1865.

Private Christian Olson

Private Christian Olson of Winchester enlisted under Captain Johnson on 2 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 18th in Madison. He was 30 years old and married.

He was sick in Bowling Green on 4 November 1862; served as an escort with the provision transport to [sic] Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was sick and was sent to the general hospital on 1 May 1864; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; and was mustered out in Madison on 8 February 1865.

Private Ellev Olson

Private Ellev Olson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 17 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He served on military police duty on 17, 20, and 24 December 1862; served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was absent because of illness on 8 and 9 July 1864; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Gunder Olson

Private Gunder Olson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 20 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was wounded and taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and died of his wounds in Atlanta on the following 21 September (or possibly on the way there).

Private Knud Olson

Private Knud Olson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 17 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He was transferred from Company C; was sent to the general hospital in Jacinto on 28 July 1862 because of illness; served on military police duty on 17 and 20 December that year; was left behind with the supply train because of illness on 11 September 1863 and was sick in Nashville on the following 19th; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 1 July 1864.

Private Lars J. Olson

Private Lars Johan Olson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He was seriously wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and died of his wounds in Murfreesboro on 16 January 1863.

Private Michael Olson

Private Michael Olson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 27 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He was sick in Bowling Green on 4 November 1862; served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was taken prisoner at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864; and died of disease in Andersonville on the following 9 November. He is buried there in grave number 11,931.

Private Ole M. Olson

Private Ole M. Olson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 15 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He was sick in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; was sick in Chattanooga on 24 December 1863; was taken prisoner in Knoxville on 1 January 1864; and died in Andersonville on the following 11 July, where he is buried in grave number 3,162.

Private Peter Olson

Private Peter Olson of Christiana, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 10 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He was sent to the hospital in Jacinto on 28 July 1862 because of illness, became unfit for service, and was discharged in St. Louis on the following 26 September.

Private Søren Olson

Private Søren Olson of Wilber's Creek enlisted under Captain Johnson on 14 December 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was sick in Tullahoma, Tennessee, on 1 July 1863; was sick in Stevenson on the following 28 August; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 15 February 1864.

Private Thomas Olson

Private Thomas Olson of Stoughton enlisted under Captain Johnson on 23 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was absent on recruiting service in November 1863 and was mustered out with the company.

Private Tideman Olson

Private Tideman Olson of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 15 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was discharged as unfit for service in Jacinto, Mississippi, on 7 August 1862, or in Cairo, Illinois, on the ninth of that month.

Private John S. Opdahl

Private John S. Opdahl of Leeds, Columbia County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 12 September 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 20 September 1863 and was sent to Libby in Richmond, and later to Andersonville, where he died of diarrhea on 22 June 1864; he is buried there in grave number 2,309.

Private Herman Peterson

Private Herman Peterson of Spring Prairie, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 31 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 28 years old and single.

He was with the Pioneer Corps in November 1862; died of disease in Chattanooga on 11 June 1864; and is buried in the national cemetery there, section ^E 6, grave number ¹¹³⁴² 51.

Private Peter Peterson

Private Peter Peterson of Primrose enlisted under Captain Johnson on 16 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was seriously wounded in the arm at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864 and was sent to the hospital. He was mustered out with the company.

Private William W. Perkins

Private William W. Perkins of Westport, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 16 November 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He 44 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green in September 1862, whence he was discharged as unfit for service on 9 January 1863.

Private Harden Rossing

Private Harden Rossing of Christiana, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 13 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 20th in Madison. He was 49 years old and married.

He was sick in Bowling Green on 4 November 1862; was with the brigade on military police duty on 12 and 17 June 1863; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 1 September 1864.

Private Mathias Schioll

Private Mathias Schioll of La Crosse enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 4 April 1864 and was mustered in on the same day in his hometown.

He joined the company at Dallas on 15 May and was transferred to Company H on 1 December 1864, was then transferred to the 24th Infantry, and from there was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Ole N. Skjelde

Private Ole Nilson Skjelde of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 24 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He died of disease on Island Number 10 on 14 May 1862 and is buried in the Mississippi River Cemetery near Memphis.

Private John S. Skjelstad

Private John S. Skjelstad of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 3 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 19 years old and single.

He served on military police duty on 17, 20 and 24 December 1862; was wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and was sent to the hospital; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Anfin Syvertson

Private Anfin Syvertson (Sjursen) of Windsor enlisted under Captain Johnson on 11 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He suffered minor wounds at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital; was absent because of illness on 23 July 1864; was wounded and sent to the North; and was mustered out with the company.

Sergeant Brown Syverson

Sergeant Brown Syverson of Deerfield enlisted under Captain Johnson on 22 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 28 years old and single; had blue eyes, blond hair, and a dark complexion; stood 5' 6" tall; and was a sailor.

He was sick in the hospital in Murfreesboro on 23 June 1863; was with the transport from Stevenson; and was wounded in the head at New Hope Church on 27 May 1864. He died of his wounds in the hospital in Chattanooga on the following 6 July and is buried in the cemetery there, section E, grave number ^{JUNE ?} 536. ¹¹⁷³⁴

Private Carl Syvertson

Private Carl Syvertson of Cambridge enlisted under Captain Johnson on 20 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 26th in Madison. He was 29 years old and single.

He was left behind in Humboldt, Tennessee, because of illness; was sick in Nashville on 8 and 9 December 1862; was sick in Louisville at the end of that month; was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 6 October 1863; and was discharged from the 8th Regiment of the Veteran Reserve Corps in Chicago on 25 November 1864.

Private Syvert Syvertson

Private Syvert Syvertson of Jackson, La Crosse County, enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 5 January 1864 and was mustered in on the same day in La Crosse. He was 30 years old.

He joined the Regiment in Knoxville on the following 19 February; was wounded at Resaca on 14 May that year; was transferred to Company H; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Herman Thoreson

Private Herman Thoreson of Pleasant Spring enlisted under Captain Johnson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 35 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Stones River on 31 December 1862; was exchanged and back in the Regiment on 1 May 1863; and was mustered out with the company.

Sergeant Anders G. Urnäs

Sergeant Anders G. Urnæs of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 28 October 1861 and was mustered in on 16 November in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was wounded in the chest at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and was sent to the hospital; was absent on recruiting duty on 20, 21 and 22 November 1863; and was mustered out with the company. He was a standard-bearer, and in 1893 he was living in Urness, Minnesota.

Private Peter Urnæs

Private Peter Urnæs of Black Earth enlisted under Captain Johnson on 29 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 31st in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was sick in the hospital in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; died there of disease on the following 19 October; and is buried in the cemetery in Nashville, section N, grave number ¹⁰⁴⁴⁵ 236.

Corporal Ole J. Urnæs

Corporal Ole Johnson Urnæs of Black Earth enlisted under Sergeant (?) Wilson on 5 January 1864 and was mustered in on the 28th in Madison. He was 22 years old.

He joined the company at Strawberry Plains; was sick on the following 22 May; was transferred to Company H at Lookout Creek; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865. In 1893 he was living in Urness, Minnesota.

Private Jørgen C. Veile

Private Jørgen C. Veile of Milwaukee enlisted under Captain Johnson on 30 December 1861 and was mustered in on 1 January 1862 in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

In accordance with Colonel Heg's orders he was with the 8th Wisconsin Battery in July 1863; re-enlisted under Captain Stiles, the same battery, on 5 January 1864; and therefore was not mustered out with the company.

Private Peter Walin

Private Peter Walin of Fox Lake, Dodge County, enlisted under Captain Johnson on 15 November 1861 and was mustered in on the 16th in Madison. He was 27 years old and single.

He was sick and was sent as a convalescent to the camp at Murfreesboro on 7 May 1863; had been sick for a long time and was reported sick up until 29 May 1863; was transferred to the

Veteran Reserve Corps on 1 November that year; and was mustered out in New Albany, Indiana, on 22 November 1864 when his term of service had expired.

Private Syvert Wilkinson

Private Syvert Wilkinson of La Crosse enlisted under Captain B. F. Cooper on 17 February 1864 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 20 years old.

He joined the Regiment at Strawberry Plains at the end of March; was transferred to Company H on 1 December 1864; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

This company was mustered out in Chattanooga, Tennessee, on 1 December 1864.

Company C

Captain Fredrick Berg

Captain Fredrick Berg of Milwaukee received his commission on 22 November 1861, effective from the 19th. He entered into service in Madison on 1 January 1862. He was 44 years old and married.

He resigned the following 12 June, and his resignation took effect the same day.

Captain Hans Hanson

Captain Hans Hanson of Norway, Racine County, was named 1st lieutenant on 22 November 1861, effective from the 19th, and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 24 years old and married.

He was promoted to captain on 23 June 1863, effective from the 12th; was wounded in the Battle of Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; and died of his wounds on the following 13 October. He is buried in the cemetery in Marietta, Georgia, section A, grave G; he was transported there from Atlanta.

Captain Hans Hanson was born on the Grinde farm in Sogn, Norway, in 1837. He came to America with his parents in 1846. When he was 18 years old, his father died and he had to take over running the farm.

Hanson led the company from the time of Captain Berg's discharge and took an active part in all the Regiment's battles and skirmishes until he was wounded at Chickamauga. Once, as the Regiment advanced, the blade of his sword was broken straight across by a bullet; during a short rest he showed the hilt with its stub to Colonel Johnson and said, as he smiled good-humoredly as always, "This is beginning to be hot work." A short while later, when their own lines opened fire on them from behind in confusion, he was shot in the head. He fell into the

hands of the enemy and was taken to Atlanta, where he died a few days later. He was beloved and respected by his comrades, and is remembered by them as a brother.

Captain John T. Rice

Captain John T. Rice of Waterford was named 2nd lieutenant on 28 December 1861, effective from 19 November. He was mustered in on 11 January 1862 in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was promoted to 1st lieutenant on 23 June 1862, effective from the 12th; was left behind in Nashville because of illness on the following 26 December; was acting regiment quartermaster in May 1863; had leave in November of that year; was promoted to captain on 20 April 1864, effective from the seventh; and was mustered out with the company.

2nd Lieutenant James Larson

Second Lieutenant James Larson of Perry, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Grinager and was mustered in on 28 February 1862 in Madison. He was 27 years old and married.

He was promoted to sergeant, and then to 2nd lieutenant on 16 July 1862, effective from the ninth; was acting quartermaster for a while in April 1863; was acting commissary[#] with the 3rd Brigade in May of that year; was with the supply train in the 1st Division the following September, and was then in command of that transport; was left behind in Chattanooga because of illness on the following 28 November; was the temporary commander of Company A for a while; was the acting post commander at Strawberry Plains in March 1864; served as ambulance

director at brigade headquarters the following April; was absent because of illness on 29 September that year; was promoted to 1st lieutenant on the following 29 October, but was not mustered in as such; and was mustered out with the company.

2nd Lieutenant Niels Johnson

Second Lieutenant Niels Johnson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 12 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 29 years old and single.

He was a corporal, served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was a sergeant and sick in Chattanooga on 28 November 1863; was transferred to the 68th Indiana on 1 February 1864; was transferred back to the company on the following 1 April; and was mustered out with the company.

He is entered above as corporal in 1863, which must be incorrect because he had already been named sergeant on 1 May 1862. On 25 February 1867 he was named 2nd lieutenant, effective from 19 October 1864. He is entered in the Roll of Honor for the 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, 20th Army Corps.

Niels Johnson was born in Bylderup, Slesvig, on 22 November 1833. His father died when he was nine and he had to live among strangers then. When he was 21 years old he became a conscript and was put into the 3rd Dragoon Regiment in Aarhus, Jutland, where he remained for a year and a half. In 1859 he came to America and started out as a farm laborer. After the war he bought himself a farm at North Cape in Racine County, Wisconsin.

Noncommissioned Officers and Privates

Private Peter Anderson

Private Peter Anderson, the elder, of Raymond, enlisted under Captain Berg on 20 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and was absent because of his wounds. He was mustered out with the company.

Private Peter Anderson

Private Peter Anderson, the younger, of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg and was mustered in on 2 December 1861. He was 18 years old and single.

He served as an escort with the transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was transferred to the 68th Indiana Regiment on 1 February 1864; was transferred back on the following 1 April; and was mustered out with the company.

Corporal Martin Amundson

Corporal Martin Amundson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 28 years old and single.

He was sick in Bowling Green on 17 September 1862; was sick in Nashville on the following 6 and 31 December; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 1 December 1863.

Private Arne Arneson

Private Arne Arneson of Milwaukee enlisted under Captain Berg on 19 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He died in the Regimental Hospital in Madison on 10 February 1862.

Private Herman Berg

Private Herman Berg of Milwaukee enlisted under Captain Berg on 2 December 1861 and was mustered in on 10 January 1862 in Madison. He was 22 years old and single.

He was sick in Springfield, Kentucky, on 7 October 1862; was in the hospital in Bowling Green immediately after that; was taken prisoner near Bardstown in the same state, where he had been left behind because of illness on 21 October; was a prisoner of war on parole in the camp at Lew Wallace, Ohio, — 1863; served on military police duty in Columbus, Ohio, on 1, 4 and 11 April 1863; and was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 15 January 1864.

Private Ole Bergeson

Private Ole Bergeson of Norway (Racine County?) enlisted under Captain Berg on 18 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was married, but no age is listed.

He was seriously wounded at Stones River on 30 December 1862 and was sent to Nashville, and from there to Chicago; became unfit for service; and was discharged in St. Louis on 3 June 1864.

Private Knud O. Brager

Private Knud O. Brager of Black Earth probably enlisted under Captain Berg and was mustered in with the others. He was 18 years old and single.

He was transferred to Company B in April 1862 in accordance with Colonel Heg's orders, but because of an oversight he is not entered on the latest Rolls of the company, and because of this the compiler has also neglected the little information about him that one could expect to find in this company's Rolls. This is regrettable, but it is too late to correct now.

Private Knud Brunson

Private Knud Brunson (Brownson), of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 25 February 1862 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 47 years old and married.

He was sick in Bowling Green on 4 November 1862; was a hospital orderly from 9 May until 29 June 1864; and was mustered out with the company.

Private James P. (B.) Brown

Private James P. (B.) Brown of Racine enlisted under Colonel Heg on 29 November 1862 and was mustered in on the following 5 December in Madison. He was 32 years old; had blue eyes, brown hair, and a fair complexion; stood 5' 4" tall; and was a tailor.

He joined the company at Murfreesboro on 16 January 1863; served with the brigade's commissary department[#] the following month of November; was sick in Chattanooga in December 1863; and died of diarrhea in Racine, Wisconsin, on 15 June 1864.

Private Edward Burk

Private Edward Burk of Waterford enlisted under Captain Berg on 1 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 2nd in Madison. He was 45 years old and married.

He became ill and was given home leave on 2 March 1862, became unfit for service, and was discharged on Island Number 10 on the following 24 May. He re-enlisted again under Upham on 30 August of the year; became sick in Nashville on the following 26 December; and was discharged the same day because he had become unfit for service.

Sergeant William Carpenter

Sergeant William Carpenter of Waterford enlisted under J. L. Rice on 30 December 1863 and was mustered in on 17 February 1864 in Madison. He was 27 years old.

He joined the Regiment at Strawberry Plains on 31 March; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; was transferred from there to the 24th Infantry; was promoted to sergeant from corporal on 20 January 1865; and was transferred to Company K in the 13th Infantry.

Private Enock Christopherson

Private Enock Christopherson of Milwaukee enlisted under Captain Berg on 18 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 32 years old and single.

He was sick in Milwaukee on 2 September 1862; he was mustered out with the company.

Private James P. Daniels

Private James P. Daniels of Vernon, Waukesha County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 1 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 10th in Madison. He was 37 years old and married.

He was left behind in Iuka on 21 August 1862 because of illness; was sick in Chattanooga on 28 November 1863; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Daniel Danielson

Private Daniel Danielson of Muskego enlisted under Captain Berg on 10 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 12th in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was sick in Nashville in July 1863 and died in Muskego, Wisconsin, on the following 25 October while he was home on leave.

Private Marquis L. Davis

Private Marquis L. Davis of Waterford enlisted under J. L. Rice on 4 January 1864 and was mustered in on 17 February in Madison. He was 21 years old.

He was transferred to Company H at Whiteside, and later to Company K in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Axel M. N. Day (Dag?)

Private Axel M. N. Day (Dag?) of Racine enlisted under Colonel Heg on 29 November 1862 and was mustered in on 5 December in Madison. He was a soldier.

He joined the Regiment at Murfreesboro on 1 February 1863, became unfit for service, and was discharged the following April.

Private Robert S. Dingman

Private Robert S. Dingman of Waterford enlisted under Captain Berg on 30 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 38 years old and married; had blue eyes, dark hair, and fair skin; stood 5' 5" tall; and was a clergyman.

He deserted from Madison, Wisconsin, on 2 May 1862, and the War Department has not heard from him since.

Private Andrew Ellickson

Private Andrew Ellickson of Pleasant Spring, Dane County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 14 March 1862 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 22 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; was in Chattanooga again the following 19 November; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; was then transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry; but was mustered out in Madison on 21 March 1865. He is entered on the Roll of Honor for the 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, 20th Army Corps.

Private William Elliott

Private William Elliott of Muskego enlisted under Captain Berg on 28 December 1861 and was mustered in on 10 January 1862 in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was detained by the civil authorities in Waukesha, but escaped from them and joined the Regiment on Island Number 10 on 4 June 1862. He was taken prisoner in La Vergne, Tennessee, on the following 29 December and was sent to St. Louis to be exchanged, but his

parole was invalid and he was sent back into the field at Murfreesboro on 13 January 1863. He was a corporal, but was demoted to private in May 1862. He was mustered out with the company.

Sergeant Albert Emmonson

Sergeant Albert Emmonson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was acting hospital steward; and was mustered out with the company.

He was named brevet captain on 20 August 1867, effective from 20 September 1863, for the bravery he displayed during the Battle of Chickamauga when he took up a position at the front of his company after his captain was killed and encouraged the men by both word and deed to hold their ground, even though they were hard pressed on all sides.

Private Thomas Emmonson

Private Thomas Emmonson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 31 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He was a wagoner with the provision transport on 20 June 1863; was in the division's quartermaster corps[#] from the 30th of that month; and died of disease on Stevenson, Alabama, on 20 October 1863.

Private Erick Erickson

Private Erick Erickson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 31 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 45 years old and married.

He was left behind in Springfield, Kentucky, on 6 October 1862 and was discharged because of illness in Louisville, Kentucky, on 7 February 1863.

Sergeant Joseph Field (Fjeld?)

Sergeant Joseph Field (Fjeld?) of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was named sergeant on 1 April 1862; was sick in Murfreesboro on 2 April 1863, the same on the following 24 June; was sick in Winchester, Tennessee, on the next 27 July; became unfit for service; and was discharged on 25 August 1863.

Private Gustavus A. Field (Fjeld?)

Private Gustavus A. Field (Fjeld?) enlisted under Captain Tillapaugh in Milwaukee on 4 December 1863 and was mustered in there on the same day. He was 28 years old.

He joined the company at Knoxville on 19 September 1864; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company K in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Knud Finkleson (Finkelson?)

Private Knudt [*sic*] Finkleson (Finkelson?) of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was killed at Stones River on 31 December 1862.

Musician George Fogg

Musician George Fogg of Milwaukee enlisted under Captain Berg on 25 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 17 years old and single.

He was sick in Chattanooga on 28 November 1862. He was mustered out with the company.

Sergeant Peter George

Sergeant Peter George of Racine enlisted under Captain Berg on 26 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 24 years old and single.

He was left behind in Humboldt on 4 July 1862 because of illness, became unfit for service, and was discharged in Corinth, Mississippi, (or in Cairo, Illinois) on 25 July 1863.

Corporal Oscar W. Gibson

Corporal Oscar W. Gibson of Waterford enlisted under Captain Berg on 9 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was an orderly in brigade headquarters on 1 June 1863; was taken prisoner at the Battle of Chickamauga; and died of disease as a prisoner of war in the jail in Richmond on 2 February 1864. He is buried in the cemetery there and is entered on the Roll of Honor for the 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, 20th Army Corps.

Private Austin Goodale

Private Austin Goodale of Vernon, Waukesha County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 1 January 1862 and was mustered in on the 10th in Madison. He was 33 years old and married.

He was never reported sick or absent and was mustered out with the company.

Musician William Groshong

Musician William Groshong or Chroshong (Kroshaug?) of Waterford enlisted under Captain Berg on 20 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 32 years old and married; had blue eyes, blond hair, and fair skin; stood 5' 10" tall; and was a farmer.

He ran away in May 1862, but returned to the company on Island Number 10 on the following 4 June; was sick there immediately after that; was absent without leave in August of that year; ran off again on 3 March 1863; and was supposedly discharged by General Grant, 13th Army Corps, dated La Grange, Tennessee, on 27 November 1862. But he was actually discharged in Madison, Wisconsin, on 11 February 1863. He was enlisted under the name Chroshong (or -houg), but the discharge was made out as Groshong.

Private Elias Halvorson

Private Elias Halvorson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 18 years old and single.

He was sick in Nashville on 27 November 1862; was left behind because of illness in Manchester, Tennessee, on 1 July 1863; was absent because of illness in Vincon Valley on 9 September of that year, likewise at Wincon's Gap *[sic]*; was sick in Knoxville on the following 16 December; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Andrew Hanson

Private Andrew Hanson of Raymond, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 26 years old and single.

He was in the Pioneer Corps in November 1862 and was mustered out with the company.

Private Christopher Hanson

Private Christopher Hanson of Waterford enlisted under Captain Berg on 24 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 35 years old and married.

He was sick in Murfreesboro on 2 April 1863; served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October that year; was sick in Chattanooga on the following 24 November and until 28 December; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Gunder E. Hanson

Private Gunder E. Hanson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was killed in the Battle of Stones River on 30 December 1862.

Private Knudt Hanson

Private Knudt Hanson of Racine enlisted under Captain Berg on 20 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 21 years old and single.

He suffered minor wounds at Stones River on 30 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville the next day, and then to New Albany, Indiana. He became unfit for service and was discharged in Louisville, Kentucky, on 5 August 1863.

Private Ole Hanson

Private Ole Hanson of Racine enlisted under Colonel Heg on 29 November 1862 and was mustered in on 5 December in Madison. He was 29 years old.

He served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; and from there was transferred to Company K in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Torbjörn Hanson

Private Torbjörn Hanson of Madison enlisted under Captain Berg on 25 February 1862 and was mustered in on the same day. He was 21 years old and single.

He was left behind in Springfield, Kentucky, on 7 October 1862 because of illness and later came to the hospital in Bowling Green; was seriously wounded at Stones River on 30 December that year and was sent to the hospital in Nashville, then to New Albany, Indiana; was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; died as a prisoner of war of either diarrhea or scurvy in Richmond on 27 January 1864; and is buried in the cemetery in Danville.

Private Thosten Henrickson

Private Thosten Henrickson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 10 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 20th in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was seriously wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and was sent to Chattanooga; was absent because of his wounds in Nashville on 15 June 1864; the same in Madison on the 28th of that month and the following 30 June; was mustered out there when his term of service had expired; and is entered on the Roll of Honor for the 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, 20th Army Corps.

Private Jacob Holm

Private Jacob Holm of Raymond enlisted under Captain Berg on 27 December 1861 and was mustered in on 1 January 1862 in Madison. He was 28 years old and single.

He was absent without leave on 20 October 1862, but was then sick in New Albany, Indiana; ran away from the hospital in Cave City, Kentucky, on the following 1 November; and enlisted again in Cairo, Illinois, and joined the Navy.

Sergeant Christian Heyer

Sergeant Christian Heyer of East Randolph, Columbia County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 9 November 1861 and was mustered in on 1 January 1862 in Madison. He was 40 years old and married.

He was demoted in rank to wagon master; was taken prisoner at Stones River on 31 December 1862; was exchanged; was wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863; was absent because of his wounds; was promoted to 2nd lieutenant in Company B on 1 February 1864, but was transferred to this company again on the following 25 April; and was mustered out as a sergeant.

Private Elling Iverson

Private Elling Iverson of Norway enlisted under Captain Berg on 10 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 11th in Madison. He was 30 years old and married.

He died of disease in Bowling Green on 20 December 1862 and is buried in the cemetery in Nashville, section N, grave number ¹⁰⁷³⁵526. He was moved there.

Sergeant Hans Jacobson

Sergeant Hans Jacobson of Racine enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 25 years old and single.

He was taken prisoner at Stones River on 31 December 1862; was a prisoner of war on parole in St. Louis and then in Columbus, Ohio; was sick in Annapolis, Maryland, on 1 January and 25 September 1863; and was not mustered out with the company.

Private Salomon Jacobson

Private Salomon Jacobson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 23 December 1861 and was mustered in on 5 January 1862 in Madison. He was 32 years old and single.

He was sick in Chattanooga on 28 November 1863; was sick in New Albany on 6 January 1864; was sick in Louisville on the following 1 June; was sick in the camp hospital on 6 June; and was mustered out in Madison, Wisconsin, on the following 31 December when his term of service had expired.

Private Carl J. Johnson

Private Carl J. Johnson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 39 years old and married.

He was sick on Island Number 10 on 11 June 1862, became unfit for service, and was discharged in Iuka on the following 18 August.

Private Henrik Johnson

Private Henrik Johnson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 31 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 30 years old and married.

He was sick in Nashville on 6 December 1862, died in Bowling Green on 25 February 1863, and was transported to Nashville where he is buried in the cemetery.

Private John Johnson

Private John Johnson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 15 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 33 years old and single.

He was left behind in the hospital at Crab Orchard, Kentucky, on 20 October 1862; served on military police duty on the following 20 December; was sick in the hospital in Murfreesboro on 16 March 1863; was taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September that year; and died in Andersonville sometime in 1864. The cause and date of death are unknown.

Private Martin Johnson

Private Martin Johnson of Waterford enlisted under Sergeant Rice on 29 February 1864 and was mustered in on 16 March in Madison. He was 21 years old.

He joined the company at McDonald's Station on the following 26 April; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; was then transferred to the 24th Infantry; was sick in the Divisional Hospital on 28 May 1865; and was transferred to Company I in the 13th Infantry on 10 June 1865.

Private Peter Johnson

Private Peter Johnson of Rochester, Wisconsin, enlisted under Captain Berg on 16 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 23 years old and married.

He was sick in Union City on 20 June 1862; was taken prisoner in La Vergne, Tennessee, and was given parole, but it was invalid and he was sent back into service in Murfreesboro on 13 January 1863; was sick in Chattanooga on 28 November 1863; was taken prisoner again at Charleston, East Tennessee, on the following 28 December; and was mustered out in Madison, Wisconsin, on 10 June 1865.

Corporal Samuel Johnson

Corporal Samuel Johnson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 5 November 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 30 years old and single.

He was named corporal on 7 February 1862; was wounded at Stones River on 31 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville; was absent because of his wounds in Murfreesboro and the same in Chicago; became unfit for service; and was discharged in Louisville, Kentucky, on 15 April 1864.

Private Rasmus Jenson

Private Rasmus Jenson of Racine enlisted under Colonel Heg on 29 November 1862 and was mustered in on 5 December in Madison. He was 30 years old.

He was sick in Murfreesboro in June 1863; was wounded and taken prisoner at Chickamauga on 19 September of that year; and died as a prisoner of war in Richmond on 2 February 1864. He is buried in the cemetery in Marietta, Georgia, section A, grave number 225. Another report shows that he died in Atlanta on that date, but the same burial place is listed.

Private Jacob Jordahl

Private Jacob Jordahl of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 10 December 1861 and was mustered in on the 12th in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He suffered minor wounds at Stones River on 30 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville; served as an escort with the provision transport from Stevenson on 13 October 1863; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Peter Jørgensen

Private Peter Jørgensen of East Randolph enlisted under Captain Berg on 2 December 1861 and was mustered in on the same day in Madison. He was 31 years old and married.

He suffered minor wounds at Stones River on 30 December 1862 and was sent to the hospital in Nashville, then to the camp at Dennison, Ohio, and then to Cincinnati and Louisville. He was transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps on 1 December 1863.

Private Knudt Knudtson

Private Knudt Knudtson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 24 years old and married.

He was taken prisoner at Stones River on 31 December 1862, was exchanged, but was taken prisoner again at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863. He was then a prisoner of war and

was never heard from after that. It says above that he was exchanged, but the records only mention that he was in St. Louis on parole. If he was not exchanged, but went into the lines again anyway, he would naturally have been shot when he was taken prisoner for the second time.

Sergeant J. J. Lansworth

Sergeant John J. Lansworth of Norway, ———, enlisted under Captain Berg on 11 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 20 years old and single.

He was wounded at Chickamauga on 19 September 1863 and was sent to Chattanooga; was transferred to the 68th Indiana on 1 February 1864; was sent back to the company on 1 April of that year; and was mustered out with the company.

Private Ole Larson

Private Ole Larson of Oakland, Jefferson County, enlisted under Captain Berg on 21 October 1861 and was mustered in on 2 December in Madison. He was 34 years old and married.

He was sick in Bowling Green in November 1862 and died of disease in Nashville on the following 15 December. He is buried in the cemetery there, section A, grave number ~~439~~ ✓ 17/36

Private S. C. Larson

Private Søren C. Larson of Norway, Racine County, enlisted under Sergeant J. L. Rice on 12 December 1863 and was mustered in on 11 January 1864 in Madison. He was 22 years old.

He joined the company at Strawberry Plains on 31 March; was transferred to Company H at Whiteside; was transferred from there to the 24th Infantry; and was then transferred to Company K in the 13th Infantry.
