Hi Jimmy,

Sorry, but we stayed in the mountains longer than we had planned. I was able to receive your message but couldn't send a reply. Anyway, the will was written on October 7,, 1870 but the date you need for them to look it up is the probate date which was in Marshall County on November 7, 1870. I show that Andrew J. Cleek and Wesley Lynch (my sons) were executors of the estate and the land was not to be sold until Amanda was (if memory serves me correctly) 21 years old. The land records for the sales all appear to be in deed book Z and were sold among the brothers and sisters. Amanda's 1/10th was sold to her sister Cynthia and her husband James Claxton. Sarah Elizabeth and her husband J. Wesley Lynch sold their portion to Andrew J. Cleek. Cynthia and James Claxton sold their land to Andrew J. James M. sold his land to Hiram Hopper who in turn sold it back to Andrew J. I never found a record of Henry R.'s sale of the land but he was living in Crockett Co. at the time and would have been in loose records most likely and they are hard to locate. The same for Nancy Cleek who was living in Gibson or Dyer at that time. Ten of the 13 children were living at the time but I'm not certain which ones were deceased. And I don't know what Andrew J did with the land. I never found a record of him selling the land but in 1880 he appears to be living as a 'boarder' with another family. In 1882 it appears he may have married a Victoria C. Beard and I've never found him after that time.

I assume that the E. A. and A. J. you refer to are both Confederate soldiers. The E. A. would have been the son of Samuel (brother to William and Joseph) and the A. J. would have been the son of James (brother to William and Joseph). E. A. is Ezekiel Alexander and moved to Obion Co., TN. while A. J. is also Andrew J. and he had moved to Lawrence Co. with James and his family several years before the war. After the war James and several of the children including this Andrew J. moved to Dyer and then to Crockett Co. in West TN.

Hope this helps.
