*Original Letter*

Tennessee With in 12 miles  
of Nashville. Mi Dear  
father. I take this  
present oportunity  
to Drop yu al few lines  
to let yu no that  
i am Well at present  
and i hope that these  
few lines will find  
yu al in the same  
state of helth  
We lef Leuise vill  
the first Day of  
Jne We have bin  
at marching ever  
since untill last  
Sunday a weak a go  
We have Soped hear  
along the pike how  
long We Will Say har  
i Dont no. Some of  
them Sayes that We  
Stay hear this Winter.

But how it is  
i Dont no for i  
We cant tell nothing  
a Bout it. We ma  
and We ma not.  
i am sorry to tell  
yu that James  
Miller is Dead. he  
Died on Sondag  
While we was out  
on picket.  
he died the 16 ast 10 ocloc  
in the morning  
he died easy. he died  
With the Billious  
fever. We have got  
But about 30  
men in our camp.  
We marched from  
glasgow to lebnon  
and on our way  
Back We had about  
30 of our men taking  
prisner by Morgan  
cavalry. Christian  
Zaney Was one  
of them. i am  
left a loan now  
i Will try and  
Stick it out  
as Well as i can.  
i hear the cannons  
roaring at morning

Tennessee — Within 12 miles  
of Nashville. My dear  
Father. I take this  
present opportunity  
to drop you a few lines  
to let you know that  
I am well at present

We left Louisville  
the first day of  
June. We have been  
at marching ever  
since until last  
Sunday, a week ago.  
We have stopped here  
along the pike, how  
long we will stay here  
I don't know. Some of  
them say that we  
stay here this winter.

But how it is  
I don't know for I --  
We can't tell anything  
about it. We may  
and we may not.  
I am sorry to tell  
you that James  
Miller is dead. He  
died on Sunday  
while we was out  
on picket.  
He died the 16th, at 10 o'clock  
in the morning.  
He died easy. He died  
with the bilious  
fever. We have got  
but about 30  
men in our camp.  
We marched from  
Glasgow to Lebanon  
and on our way  
back, we had about  
30 of our men taken  
prisoner by Morgan's  
cavalry. Christian  
Zaney was one  
of them. I am  
left alone now.  
I will try and  
stick it out  
as well as I can.
