Person Notes: Wounded in left shoulder by a musket ball, smashing the bones. This happened at the Battle of Stone River, Tenn. 30th of December 1862. Thomas was captured the on the 31st when the hospital was overrun by the Confederate forces. He was paroled as a prisoner of war on January 2nd, 1863 in the hospital near Murfreesboro, Tenn. He was disabled, discharged as a Private on March 15, 1863. As he was known later as "Major" he may have served in a Home Guard unit or Invalid Corps.



