A Short History of the Miller Family

The Miller side of the family, that of my father's mother, has been traced thus far to Luther George Miller who was born on 22 August 1828 in Clermont County, Ohio, the state's furthest county west in Appalachia. About the age of nine years he developed epilepsy.

When Luther enlisted in the Army on 21 January 1849, he was twenty-one years old, five foot eleven inches tall, had dark eyes, auburn colored hair, and a light complexion. He was a painter at the time. In 1850 Luther was living with John J. and Margaret Miller in Ward 2, Cincinnati County, Ohio. According to the census of that year, John Miller was a painter, and Luther was a "river character" and could read and write. By 1853, Luther was in Kentucky when he married Abi J. Peck in Mason County on 7 July. When the 1860 census was enumerated, Luther and Abi were living in Jamestown, Campbell County, Kentucky, with their three children: John Thomas (b. abt 1854), Ann Eliza (b. abt. 1857), and Richard (b. abt. 1859). Luther worked as a painter again.

On 25 September 1861 Luther was enlisted by Captain Eagan into the 23rd Regiment of Kentucky Volunteers Infantry for a three-year term--during the Civil War. He served in Company E under Captain John Barnes, a Union company that was raised in the Campbell-Kenton counties area the same year. The 23rd Regiment was officially organized at Camp King, Lexington, Kentucky; the enlistees mustered in on 2 January 1862.

During his service, Luther and Abi had their fourth child, Luther's namesake, Luther George (June 1862).

With the intent of blocking the Union's advance on Chattanooga, the Confederate Army was camped at the end of 1862 at Murfreesboro, Tennessee, a small town in the Stones River Valley. President Lincoln had ordered an aggressive attack. General William S. Rosecrans marched his corps, now designated as the Army of Cumberland, in three columns or "wings" toward Murfreesboro. Daddy's great grandfather Luther was part of the left wing. The 14,000 plus men in this wing, led by Major General Thomas L. Crittendon, took a route that was parallel to the Nashville and Chattanooga railroad, passing through La Vergne and south of Smyrna. Before reaching Murfreesboro, the left wing was engaged in battle and Sergeant Luther George Miller was "mightily" wounded in the left breast. He was temporarily relieved from duty. The injury continued to create health issues and in June 1864, Luther was granted a disability discharge in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

He returned to his family in Kentucky, and about a year later Luther and Abi had another son. William Henry Miller, my father's grandfather, was born in Dayton on 11 July 1865. Three more children were born over the next eleven years: Abi J. (1868), Samuel M. (1871) and Frederick T. (1876). William Henry, known as "Bill," was about twelve years old when his father died, and his mother Abi remained in Campbell County, Kentucky until her death in 1921.

According to family data records William Henry first married Pricilla Fugate; and, they had one son John Leonard (Nov 1889, KY). Then, William Henry married Johanna Willamena Docter. Called Hanna, she was the daughter of German immigrants Henry and Anna Docter. William Henry and Hanna had their first child Henry Andrew (1896) in Dayton, Kentucky. Their second child Abi Josephus (1897) was born in Ohio. Sometime after her birth, William Henry moved his family to Vermilion County, Illinois, where his next five children were born. Daddy's mother, Frances, was born in 1900 in the small village of Grape Creek, a namesake of the creek which flowed through it. Luther George (1902), Richard C. (1903), Josephine (1911), and Clara (1914) were all born in Danville. The move to Vermilion County was made as William Henry was a coal miner, and he went to work the mines.

The 23rd Kentucky Infantry was organized at Camp King in Lexington, Kentucky and mustered in for a three year enlistment on January 2, 1862 under the command of Colonel Marcellus Mundy.

The regiment was attached to District of Kentucky, Department of the Ohio, to March 1862. 23rd Independent Brigade, Army of the Ohio, to July 1862. 10th Brigade, 4th Division, Army of the Ohio, to September 1862. 10th Brigade, 4th Division, II Corps, Army of the Ohio, to November 1862. 3rd Brigade, 2nd Division, Left Wing, XIV Corps, Army of the Cumberland, to January 1863. 3rd Brigade, 2nd Division, XXI Corps, Army of the Cumberland, to October 1863. 2nd Brigade, 3rd Division, IV Corps, to August 1864. 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, IV Corps, to June 1865. 1st Brigade, 1st Division, IV Corps, to August 1865. The 23rd Kentucky Infantry mustered out of service on December 27, 1865.

Casualties

The regiment lost a total of 191 men during service; 5 officers and 84 enlisted men killed or mortally wounded, 102 enlisted men died of disease.






Descendant Chart for Luther George Miller



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
