I have writen this severel times but for fear you dont get the letters I will rite it again I received Brother Jerys letter of the 11th a few dayes ago which had a peace in it for TD Jinkens but he was not hear to get it I am very Sory that the frost?? has don So much injury but the will of the Master must be don Well you spoke of your uneasyness and trouble in minde about yours absent son and his Comrades. I have no dout but it is a hard thing but when I see the neecesesity?? and See so maney men fall all for the same cause I am Compelled my dear Parents to inform you that I cant desert the field No I cant quit the Service till I see the last Trator put to flight it is hard to be absent from a Parent Brather & Sister in the dangers that is heare besides the heat and Coal and fategue that is allways on a man, the dayes comes close when in 62. I was at home but the Same Season I am at Chattanooga in 63 when the last year I was in Ky I

shall soon have to close The Boyes is all well that is hear Burnett is over the river with a Sore Foot I hant seen him in about a month.

Cat Simmons is hear by my Side writing he is a splendid man Cool and Patriatick in the Batle or out of Batle he is always the same

## INDEX

This is a “semi-index” to help make the letters of Daniel, Jeremiah and Jonathan Moore more accessible than reading them from start to finish. Since they spelled phonetically and also didn’t always fully identify individuals consistently, a standard index could leave out individuals that should not be left out or incorrectly indicate that various citations were the same individual when they were not. I maintained their spelling, as best I could interpret it from his letters. I included titles such as “Uncle” even when a specific individual was not noted.

So, in an effort to make them more accessible, I went through their letters page by page. When an individual was mentioned, other than his mother or his father (they are basically mentioned on every page), I included it under that page number in this index. Therefore, in order to determine whether an individual you are searching for is mentioned, you will need to look at the names on each page. You will then need to judge for your self whether the citation is close enough in spelling to be the individual you are searching for. When you find an interesting entry, simply look to the page, where it is included, and read the passage where the individual is mentioned.
