J.H. Wray

Eliza I am sorry to say that I have some bad for you but I am in hopes that you will be prepared to receive it Eliza you told me in your letter to tell John Snell that his folks was all well but I could not do it he got killed dead on the battle field at peryvill [sic] I don't [sic] no [sic] what part of his person were hit I no [sic] nothing about the particulars I saw bud [sic] Willson passing bye [sic] and he told him about it but [3 illegible words] time to stop [illegible] he never [illegible] any of the particulars about it

Like for you to send me some [illegible] for I need them very bad mother I would send you some money if I had it but I hante [sic] got it we hante [sic] drawn no money in along [sic] time but they say we will draw [illegible] in [illegible] days and I will send you some nothing more at present I remain yours truly James H Wray
