Trail and Byway Management Planning Underway

The combined management planning process for the Star-Spangled Banner National Historic Trail and Star-Spangled Banner Byway is underway! The plan, which will be completed by fall 2011, identifies the significant stories and resources of the Trail and Byway, and establishes how the Trail and Byway will be developed and managed over the next 15-20 years.

War of 1812 Projects Receive Gateways Funding

Several War of 1812 projects have received funding from NPS' [Chesapeake Bay Gateways and Watertrails Network](#) (Gateways). Bladensburg Waterfront Park received funding to develop water and classroom-based programming and to complete docent training on a sailor's life in 1812; those projects are almost complete. Partners in Fells Point and five Gateways in Havre de Grace received funding to develop interpretive and educational materials and programming. The Baltimore National Heritage Area has received NPS funding to develop a traveling exhibit

on the War of 1812 in the Chesapeake to connect people with Maryland's War of 1812 stories at schools, libraries, historic sites, and parks throughout Maryland and the country. The Friends of Fort McHenry and the Living Classrooms Foundation received funding to develop the Star-Spangled Banner Virtual Resource Center, which will make educational materials available to educators, researchers and historians, virtual Trail visitors, and more.

Signage Plan Underway

With funding secured for 150 Star-Spangled Banner interpretive wayside signs in Maryland, NPS and the Maryland War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission are making plans for the development and installation of these signs. A signage survey for partner sites is forthcoming. It will help NPS and the MD Commission identify potential sign locations and interpretive text.



Interpretive Plan Under Review

The Interpretive Plan for the Star-Spangled Banner National Historic Trail and Star-Spangled Banner Scenic Byway will be circulated to partners at the end of August and early September. The plan provides an interpretive framework for telling the Trail's stories at sites and along trail segments, outlines priorities and goals for developing robust land and water experiences for visitors, and identifies target audiences. War of 1812 Projects Receive Grants from MHAA



Several War of 1812 Projects recently received grants from the [Maryland Heritage Areas Authority](#); some of these projects leverage NPS funding.. The Port Towns Community Development Corporation received money for a War of 1812 mural in Bladensburg. The Star-Spangled Virtual Resource Center through the Friends of

Fort McHenry and the Living Classrooms Foundation also received money from MHAA.. Museums in Havre de Grace received money to support a schools-based oral history project, scale model of War of 1812-era town, and a traveling exhibition. Benedict and Sotterley both received grants for interpretation, and the Calvert Marine Museum received funding for a Southern Maryland 1812 Map and Guide.

Senate Authorizes Commemorative Coin

The U.S. Senate has passed H.R. 2097, The Star-Spangled Banner Bicentennial Commemorative Coin Act, which directs the U.S. Treasury to produce 500,000 \$1 silver coins and 100,000 \$5 gold coins. Coins will be issued beginning January 1, 2012. Surcharges from the coins will generate up to \$8.5 million for the Maryland War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission, who is responsible for providing a match in private funds.

Virginia and Maryland to Welcome OpSail

[Operation Sail, Inc.](#) (OpSail) and the U.S. Navy will bring tall ships and naval vessels to five ports from May to July 2012 to commemorate the War of 1812. Norfolk, VA, and Baltimore, MD, are two of the five ports. For more information, contact [Kate Marks](#).



Virginia Planning New Historic Markers

Currently 40 historical highway markers interpret the War of 1812 in Virginia. The Virginia Bicentennial of the American War of 1812 Commission is working with the Virginia Department of Historic Resources to develop fifteen new markers related to the War of 1812. Star-Spangled 200 Conference Series

The [Maryland War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission](#) presented the *North Point Star-Spangled 200 Conference* - a day of presentations and area tours in Baltimore County related to the War of 1812's Battle of North Point - for stakeholders in the Bicentennial celebration. Baltimore County Executive Jim Smith announced the formation of a Baltimore County War of 1812 bicentennial advisory committee, which will help the county convey its War of 1812 heritage to residents and visitors.

Other speakers included: Vince Vaise, Chief of Interpretation at Fort McHenry; Ross Kimmel, Historian for the Maryland Park Service; Ed Seufert, a Royal Marines living historian; and Larry Leone, representing Todd's Inheritance.

Search for the *USS Scorpion*

Underwater archaeologists from the Maryland Historical Trust, the US Navy, and Maryland State Highway Administration surveyed the Patuxent River in Prince George's County in late July and early August. They hoped to find the *USS Scorpion* or other War of 1812 vessel of the Chesapeake Flotilla scuttled to prevent capture by the British in 1814. Information gathered from this excavation will inform interpretation of the Trail and events associated with the Bicentennial. A full excavation of the shipwreck is planned for 2012.
