The Indian Arts and Crafts Act

Under the Act, it is unlawful to offer or display for sale, or sell, any art or craft product in a manner that falsely suggests it is Indian produced, an Indian product, or the product of a particular Indian Tribe.



Definition of Indian

- Enrolled member of a federally recognized American Indian Tribe, Alaska Native Village, or Alaska Native Corporation as defined under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act
- Enrolled member of an officially State recognized Tribe
- Certified non-member Indian artisan

Definition of State Recognized Tribe

- "any Indian group that has been formally recognized as an Indian Tribe by a State legislature or be a State commission or similar organization legislatively vested with State tribal recognition authority"
- Must have the "force of law"
- Governor's proclamation is inadequate

Certified non-member Indian Artisan

- Certification by the governing body of a Tribe or by a certifying body delegated this function by the governing body of the Indian Tribe
- Individual is of Indian lineage of one or more enrolled members of the certifying Indian Tribe
- Certification must be in writing
- A Tribe may not impose a fee for certifying an Indian artisan

Criminal Penalties

Initial Penalties for a Violation if the total sale amount is LESS than \$1,000 Individual – fines up to \$25,000 and/or – imprisonment not to exceed one year Corporate

- fines up to \$100,000

Criminal Penalties

Initial Penalties for a Violation if the total sale amount is MORE than \$1,000 Individual – fines up to \$250,000 and/or – Imprisonment not to exceed five years Corporation

- fines up to \$1,000,000

Criminal Penalties

Subsequent Violations, regardless of total amount for sale <u>Individual</u> – fines up to \$1,000,000 and/or – Imprisonment not to exceed 15 years <u>Corporation</u>

- fines up to \$5,000,000

IACB/FWS IACA Enforcement Collaboration

- Through the Indian Arts and Crafts Amendments Act of 2010, Congress authorized any federal law enforcement officer to conduct IACA investigations
- IACA cases have had a nexus with FWS statutes such as the Marine Mammal Protection Act, Migratory Bird Treaty Act, and Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act
- In March 2012 IACB entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with FWS Office of Law Enforcement for IACA investigations

Civil Penalties

- Injunctive or other equitable relief
- Treble damages, or no less than \$1,000 for each day of offer or display for sale
- Punitive damages
- Costs of suit

Civil Suits – Who Can Sue?

- Indian Tribe
- Indian Arts and Crafts Organization
- Individual Indian
- Attorney General of the United States (on behalf of the above)

Navajo Nation vs. Urban Outfitters

- Filed by Navajo Nation in February 2012, against Urban Outfitters and several of its subsidiaries
- Urban Outfitters marketed several products as "Navajo" or "Navaho," including clothing, jewelry, and household accessories



- Complaint alleged both Trademark infringement and Indian Arts and Crafts Act violations
- Case settled in November 2016. Urban Outfitters and Navajo Nation entered into a supply and licensing agreement

Pendleton Woolen Mills (Settlement, 2013)

- Pendleton Woolen Mills marketed products using the unqualified terms "Sioux" and "Lakota"
- December 9, 2013, settlement agreement between IACB, U.S. Department of Justice, and Pendleton
- Pendleton donated \$41,250 to the Heritage Center at the Red Cloud Indian School in Pine Ridge, South Dakota, for the promotion of authentic Sioux art; revised its website and catalogs to clarify its advertising language; and added information about the Act to its catalogs and website
