Judging Criteria:

- Drafting
- Composition
- Depiction of significant features
- Field records
- Dimensioning and annotation

Awards:

The Library of Congress will announce the winning drawing, and the winner will receive a \$1500 cash prize and a certificate of recognition. Merit awards of \$500 may also be given to select drawings.

The prize honors Leicester B. Holland (1882-1952), FAIA, chair man of the AIA's Committee on Historic Buildings, head of the Fine Arts Division of the Library of Congress, first curator of the HABS collection, co-founder of the HABS Program in the 1930s, and the first chair of the HABS Advisory Board.

Holland Prize is an annual competition that recognizes the best single-sheet measured drawing of a historic building, site, or structure prepared by an individual(s) to the standards of the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS), Historic American Engineering Record (HAER), or the Historic American Landscapes Survey (HALS).
