The Cormorant Skirt

Background Information

The cormorant skirt plays an important role in Karana's life, especially when she meets Tutok in chapter 21. The goal of this activity is to encourage students to think critically about the use of personal ornamentation in culture and the role it plays in human relationships. It is also designed to help students identify key details and make inferences.

It says, I say, and so: This is a graphic organizer-based strategy designed to help students make inferences, connect the text to their prior knowledge, and identify important textual details.

Materials

- Copy of activity sheet for each student (provided)
- Class set of Island of the Blue Dolphins

Procedure

- 1. Give each student a copy of the activity sheet.
- 2. Model the strategy using the example provided.
- 3. Assign students to work in pairs to complete the activity sheet.
- 4. Discuss student findings as a class.
- 5. To shorten this activity: Divide students into groups and assign each group just one question to answer.
- 6. To lengthen this activity: Have students work alone first. Then, pair them up to share their answers.

Enrichment Activities

- 1. Group brainstorm: What types of ornamentation do you wear? Why do you wear them?
- 2. Show students images of a cormorant skirt or other article of clothing made of bird feathers.
