You can participate in the Girl Scout Ranger program through any Girl Scout activity at a national park—with your troop, at an event, or during a camping or travel experience. If you spend five hours at the park for your activity, you will be get a certificate from the National Park Service. If you spend ten hours, you will be awarded a Girl Scout Ranger patch!

- Environmental education programs
- Service projects at a park

Find a site:

Visit www.nps.gov/findapark to find a park in your state or any park of interest.

Learn about opportunities:

Go to it's website to learn about it's history; the natural, cultural, and historical resources it protects; and the activities offered.

Coordinate with the site:
