## Meet Charlie DeLeo, 'The Keeper of the Flame'

Saturday, Sept. 6 at Noon

For 31 years, Charlie DeLeo conducted the honored duty of being the Statue of Liberty's "Keeper of the Flame". He has made the 151-foot climb to maintain the statue's torch more than 2,500 times in his career with the National Park Service. Mr DeLeo has held this title longer than anyone in the history of the Statue of Liberty.

Join Charlie for a one-hour presentation where he will talk about his very unique career, and the responsibilities, challenges, and adventures that came along with it. All of this will be described through the use of photos, videos, and many anecdotes.
