Track-Tac-Toe

At Theodore Roosevelt National Park, some animals eat the other animals! Deer have big eyes and ears to sense predators and use their speed to get away. Mountain lions rely on surprise to catch their prey.

In Track-Tac-Toe, one player plays as the deer while the other plays the mountain lion. Instead of writing X and O on the page, you will use deer tracks and mountain lion tracks.
