



**Topic:** Activity: Human Timeline for Fort George Island

**Level:** 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Geography (Lesson plans can be modified to your subject and grade.)

**Site of Activity:** Classroom or at Kingsley Plantation

**Designed by:** Mary P. Mott, Teacher to Ranger to Teacher,  
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**Goal:** Increase knowledge of the historical timeline of Kingsley Plantation and Fort George Island.

**Objectives:** When used the scavenger hunt activity, students will be able to:

1. The students will understand that the human and physical characteristics of different places in the world
2. How these characteristics change over time
3. How these changes affect today's societies.

**Materials:**

- Timeline cards, printed double-sided

**Activity:**

- Use with the "Matching Dates to Fort George Island's History" in the Scavenger Hunt Activity page 13 (on-site) or use in the classroom.
- Print the cards back to back (double-sided), so the date is on one side and the description and person is on the other side. The size of the cards can be changed to any size you need when you print. I have found the 11 x 17 is a good size to use when you have the students line up in front of the class.
- There are two ways to play the matching game - (1) Have the cards showing just the dates so that the class must decide on an answer for who belongs to the date, or (2) Play it with the description of the people and the students place them in correct chronological (timeline) order.
