"IMARS Lives! The NPS is rolling out IMARS to the field in 2012. Approximately 50 parks have already been trained in its use and benefits and plan on switching over full time to IMARS starting this January. If you want a peek at the system, watch from afar as a scenario is entered, or participate same-time and get valuable basic IMARS training so you too can start using the system, with your chief's blessing of course, tune in to this interactive and educational session from one ranger to another."

"Attached is the employee creation template. If you want access to the system to be able to participate at the same time as the demonstration is shown, you must fill out the attached sheet (as a park preferably) and submit it to John Evans@nps.gov before January 12th. Send an e: mail to him as soon as possible for the link to the software too. If not, you will still be able to watch and ask questions, just not enter the scenarios yourself."
