Have you ever wanted to participate in testing the latest technology? Did you ever want to do something that can make a difference? Here is your opportunity to help! CyArk operates internationally as a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization with the mission of using new technologies to create a free, 3D online library of the world's cultural heritage sites before they are lost to natural disasters, destroyed by human aggression, or ravaged by the passage of time. CyArk used 3D laser scanning and other advanced technologies to preserve and allow visitors to experience the Tule Lake Unit, WWII Valor in the Pacific National Monument in a way previously impossible, and it will be available online! They received a Japanese American Confinement Sites grant from the National Park Service for this project and they are beta testing not only for their Tule Lake project, but also for Manzanar and Topaz.
