## **National Park Service Fossil Discovery Procedure**

## **Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument**

If you believe that you have located a fossil within Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument, please help park staff by using the following procedure:

- 1. Please do not touch it.
- 2. Record GPS coordinates. If this is not possible, then record a description of where you found it. We may ask you to show a park ranger where it is located.
- 3. Please do not mark the location with anything obvious (i.e. rocks, sticks, debris, paint).
- 4. Please write a short description of what you think you may have found.
- 5. Take photographs to share only with National Park Service Rangers. Please include a close up of the fossil in one photo, and another photo with the fossil and the background horizon if possible. This will help park staff find the location.
- 6. **Please do not,** share the location information or photographs, with your friends, the general public or on any social media sites.
- 7. Forward this information to the National Park Service Superintendent at: TUSK\_Superintendent@nps.gov

Thank you for helping the National Park Service protect and preserve the non-renewable paleontological resources of Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument for current and future generations. Your discovery may also help park staff and scientists further ongoing scientific research efforts.
