Moonlight Evening at Montezuma Well

Come enjoy a special and unique opportunity at Montezuma Well. On Sunday, October 4th, the Montezuma Well unit of Montezuma Castle National Monument will stay open after normal operating hours until 9pm. The reason for staying open late will be the rising of a nearly full moon at 6:10pm. As the moon rises and the darkness of the night takes over the Well, the glow of lanterns placed in some of the prehistoric sites will, with a little imagination, bring out what the area may have been like 800 years ago. David Wolfsrobe and his flutes will add to the ambience, and overall, should make for an evening to remember. These special night programs at the monuments only occur a few times, so come out and see the monuments in a very different light.

Montezuma Well is located in Rimrock, AZ, 4 miles east of I-17. Take exit 293 eastbound and follow the signs. Bring a coat and flashlight. Parking is limited, so carpool if possible. This event is free.
