Transportation Enhancement Project for the Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route NHT in the Hudson River Valley of New York

In 2007, the Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area (HRVNHA) was awarded a Transportation Enhancement Program grant from the New York State Department of Transportation for the interpretation of the Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route in New York State. The HRVNHA and the National Park Service are working together on this important project. In 2011, the Washington-Rochambeau NHT, HRVNHA and Hudson River Valley Greenway, and a design team from the National Park Service Harpers Ferry Center began work on selecting fifteen sites of historical significance to the story of the NHT. The sites are as follows:

1. Suffern, Avon Park, Lafayette Avenue and Washington Avenue
2. Stony Point, Stony Point Battlefield State Historic Site
3. West Point, West Point Visitors Center
4. Newburgh, Washington's Headquarters State Historic Site
5. Fishkill, Van Wyck House, Fishkill Historical Society
6. Old St. Peter's, Oregon Road and Locust Avenue
7. Peekskill, Park Street and N. Division Street
8. Verplanck, Riverview Avenue
9. Yorktown Heights, Franklin D. Roosevelt State Park
10. Dobbs Ferry, Waterfront Park
11. Odell House, 425 Ridge Road , Hartsdale
12. White Plains, Tibbits Park
13. Smith's Tavern, New Castle Historical Society
14. Bedford, Bedford Village Elementary School
15. North Salem, Town Hall Complex
