The prominent location on which the tribute has been established was made possible by the authorization of the 86th Congress with the cooperation of the Commission of Fine Arts and the National Capital Planning Commission. It demonstrates the unique place Scouting occupies in the minds of America's leaders. Sculpture is by Donald DeLue of New York City. Architect of the project is William Henry Deacy also of New York City.

This tribute honors the millions of men and women who have given of their time and resources so that boys might become men of character, trained for participating citizenship. It also gives recognition to Scouting millions of boys who have rendered service to the nation.
