## Brandy Creek Recreational Vehicle Campground

### General Information

Brandy Creek RV Campground is located near the south shore of Whiskeytown Lake. To reach the campground, turn onto Kennedy Memorial Drive at the Visitor Center on Highway 299. Follow this road six miles to the Brandy Creek Marina turnoff. The campground is on the right ¼ mile from the turnoff.

Self-contained units that are allowed here include recreational vehicles, cab-over campers, pop-up tent trailers, and fifth wheels. All units must have fully self-contained toilet and wastewater devices, defined as apparatus permanently constructed within a motor vehicle for the purpose of collecting and storing human waste and wastewater for later disposal in a dump station or other device. There are no restrooms in the campground.

The maximum length allowed is 35 feet. No tents are allowed in the RV area. The campground is on the asphalt and has some shade. The 32 sites do not have tables, hookups, or fire grates. The campground has a dump station and a water source.

Pets are permitted in the campground, provided they are on leash, but they are not allowed on the swim beach.

A boat launch ramp is located near the RV campground. Jet skis and similar brands of personal watercraft are banned on Whiskeytown Lake. A swim beach with a large picnic area, restrooms, and cold showers is nearby. The showers are only available in the summer.

### Camping Fees

The fee is \$20.00 per night year-round. If you have a Golden Age or Access Passport or an Interagency Senior or Access Pass, you will receive a 50% discount on these rates, making the fee \$10.00 per night. ### How to Pay for Your Site

All reservations or payments must be made online at [www.recreation.gov](http://www.recreation.gov) or by calling toll free 1-877-833-6777. This is the only way to pay for or reserve a site at the campground. We no longer accept payment at the Whiskeytown visitor center. Reservations can be made up to six months in advance.

## **Entrance Pass**

Whiskeytown is a National Park Service site and requires an entrance fee in addition to your camping fee. You can purchase an entrance pass at the Whiskeytown visitor center or online by using your smart phone, tablet, or computer at [www.recreation.gov](http://www.recreation.gov)

You may display a Military Annual Pass, a Golden Age or Access Passport, an Interagency Annual Pass or a Senior or Access Pass in lieu of a Whiskeytown entrance pass.

## **Regulations**

1. Download your proof of payment from recreation.gov onto your phone or other device. You must be able to show this to a park ranger if requested.
2. If you take up more than one space with your RV or trailer, boat, and vehicles, you must pay the full rate for the second space that you use.
3. The camping limit is no more than 14 days from May 15 to September 15. The total limit is 30 days for the calendar year.
4. No more than 6 people are allowed per site.
5. Check out time is noon.
6. Boats and trailers cannot be left unattended at the marina overnight. Park them as close to your recreational vehicle as possible.
7. Quiet hours are between 10 PM and 6 AM. No generators may be used during this time. Other noises, such as loud voices or music, are also prohibited after 10 PM.
8. Pets must be kept in a cage or on a leash no more than 6 feet in length at all times. You may not leave pets unattended.
9. Sleeping is allowed only in self-contained vehicles. You may not sleep in a car, boat, or other vehicle that is not self-contained.
10. Tents are not allowed.
11. Do not drain or dump waste material on the ground. A sanitary dump station is available.
12. No ground fires are allowed in this campground. Fires are not allowed in portable metal fire pits or ceramic "chimeneas."

13. Whiskeytown is black bear country. All food, pet food, beverage containers, cosmetics, toiletries, cooking utensils, dishes, and other items with food odor must be stored inside your vehicle unless they are in immediate use. Store these items out of sight and odor-free, preferably in your RV. If you do not store your food properly, you may receive a citation from a park ranger.
